1. Summary

- 1.1 This report outlines an application under the Licensing Act 2003 for a variation to an existing premises licence for Alino, 11 Narborough Road, LE3 0LE, and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives and the relevant parts of both the statutory guidance and the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

2. Determination to be made

3. Application and promotion of the licensing objectives

- 3.1 An application was received on 21 March 2025 for a variation of an existing premises licence for Alino. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.

- 3.3 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section 16 of Appendix A).
- 3.4 The existing licence is attached at Appendix B.
- 3.5 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 3.6 Location Plan



4. Representations

- 4.1 A representation was received on 03 April 2025 from the Police. The representation relates to (the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public nuisance, public safety and the protection of children from harm). The representee is concerned that revellers already under the influence of alcohol will attend the venue in the early hours of the morning to source more alcohol in an area that already faces challenges in relation to crime and disorder and anti-social behaviour. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C1.
- 4.2 A representation was received on 09 April 2025 from the Noise team. The representation relates to the prevention of public nuisance. The representee is concerned that allowing the premises to operate such long hours will increase the likelihood of noise complaints and cause disturbance to residents by customers visiting the premises throughout the night and particularly into the early hours of the morning. The Noise team have now reached agreement with the applicant to add conditions to the licence if granted. A copy of the representation/agreement is attached at Appendix C2.

- 4.3 A representation was received on 15 April 2025 from the Licensing Enforcement team. The representation relates to the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public nuisance and public safety. The representee has concerns about the premises and the effects the extended hours may have on the local community, both business and residential. Conditions have been proposed to be added to the licence, if granted. A copy of the representation/proposed conditions are attached at Appendix C3.

5. Conditions

- 5.1 The conditions that are consistent with the application, representation from the Noise Team and proposed conditions from the Licensing Enforcement team are attached at Appendix D.
- 5.2 The Live Music Act 2012 and the Legislative Reform (Entertainment Licensing) Order 2014 amended the Licensing Act 2003 in relation to the provision of regulated entertainment. Certain entertainment does not require a licence subject to audience limits, between 08.00 and 23.00 hours each day. These exemptions may affect the application under consideration because conditions may not be imposed at this stage to control live or recorded music that is unregulated. However, if problems do occur as a result of that entertainment then conditions may be imposed to control such music in the future after a formal review.

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

- a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supplied alcohol), or
 - ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

- a) a holographic mark, or
- b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person shall ensure that-

- a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

The restrictions in this Annex do not prohibit any sale, supply or consumption of alcohol previously permitted by the Licensing Act 1964.

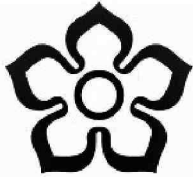

<p>I write in my capacity as Leicester City Centre's alcohol licensing officer for Leicestershire Police, with delegated authority from the Chief Constable.</p> <p>My representation to this major variation application is based upon the licensing objectives, as per the Licensing Act 2003.</p> <p>The application in its current format would undermine all four licensing objectives if granted. Those being:</p> <p>(1) The prevention of crime and disorder. (2) Public Safety.</p>

- (3) The prevention of public nuisance.
- (4) The protection of children from harm.

The premises is located on Narborough Road. Narborough Road acts as an arterial route linking the city centre with Fosse Park and junction 21 of the M1 motorway.

The area consists of high-density residential housing along the numerous side streets, with retail/commercial and licensed premises on the ground floor along Narborough Road itself. Most of the ground floor properties have residential flats directly above.

Several other licensed premises which provide alcohol for consumption on the premises are located nearby.

The premises is located within an “area of special interest” as referred to in Leicester City Council’s Statement of Licensing Policy dated 2022-2027. The application makes no reference to this policy, so it is unclear if the applicant has considered this.

The venues premises licence (LEIPRM0381) was granted in 2009, with the applicant appointed as the premises licence holder in 2014.

In 2022, the premises came to the attention of Leicestershire Police Licensing department requiring intervention.

In September 2024, Leicestershire Police and Leicester City Council Licensing Enforcement visited the premises, Despite being closed to the public at the time of the visit, as the premises was undergoing a major refurbishment, it was noted that significant alterations had been made to the internal layout of the premises.

The applicant was informed a minor variation would be required given the layout changes.

In December 2024, the police re-iterated the previous about a minor variation and the applicant stated this would be completed. To date, the police are unaware of a minor variation application given the significant alterations to the internal layout of the venue and that the premises continue to trade/open to the public.

The venues existing Leicester City Council premises licence permits the following licensable activities and operating hours:

- **Unrestricted opening hours to the public.**
- **Supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises:**
Monday to Thursday from 10am until midnight.
Friday to Sunday from 10am until 1am.
- **Playing of recorded music, performance of dance, entertainment of a similar nature and exhibition of films (indoors only):**
Monday to Thursday from 10am until midnight.
Friday to Sunday from 10am until 1am.

- **The performance of live music (indoors only):**

Monday to Thursday from 10am until midnight.

Friday from 10am until 1am.

Saturday & Sunday from 12 noon until 1am.

(No seasonal variations and late-night refreshments provision)

This major variation application proposes to increase the hours permitted for certain licensable activities on specific days of the week. Those being:

- **Supply of alcohol for consumption ON the premises only** on Friday & Saturday from 10am until 3am.

Therefore, an additional two hours on Friday & Saturday.

- Including seasonal variations on 25th December and 1st January until 3am.

- **The playing of recorded music and live music on Friday & Saturday (indoors only)** from 10am until 3am.

Therefore, an additional two hours on Friday & Saturday.

- Including seasonal variations on 25th December and 1st January until 3am.

- **Late Night Refreshments (indoors only) on Friday & Saturday** from 11pm until 3am.

Therefore, a new licensable activity.

- Including seasonal variations on 25th December and 1st January until 3am.

The application refers to several ways to promote the licensing objectives but is vague about exactly how this will be achieved. The applicant has hinted at some licence condition, but any such conditions need to be precise and enforceable for them to be valid. An example of this, states security personal will be employed at the premises on Friday and Saturday. However, it does not refer to what time they will be deployed which would suggest they would be deployed from 10am until 3am, which I suspect is not what is intended.

The Narborough Road area/corridor is a challenging environment for operators and more so those who operate in the night-time economy and who also supply alcohol for consumption on the premises.

Leicestershire Police has recorded some crime and disorder associated to the premises in the last year (closed for a period in 2024 for refurbishment), including in 2025.

Unfortunately, alcohol related violent crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour does rise in the night-time economy (10pm-7am) and this is not different along Narborough Road. Therefore, there is a real possibility that revellers already under the influence of alcohol will attend the venue in the early hours of the morning to source more alcohol.

Leicestershire Police respectfully requests the application is refused as it fails to promote all four licensing objectives.

Please summarise your concerns about this application:

The immediate area is a busy part of the city with a mixed use of mainly retail, food outlets and bars.

However, there is a first floor flat above the premises and several more adjoining on either side. There are also several residential properties opposite on Ruding Road.

The application is to extend the hours of licensable activities from:

- Midnight on Monday-Thursday
 - 0100 Hrs. on Friday -Sunday
- to 0300 Hrs. daily.

The existing licensable activities include:

- indoor playing of recorded music
- indoor performance of live music
- indoor performance of dance
- supply of alcohol.

During the daytime, road traffic, commercial activity and on-street activity are the dominant noise sources in the locality. However, later in the evening and into the early hours of the morning traffic noise and street noise noticeably reduces.

I am concerned that allowing the premises to operate such long hours will increase the likelihood of noise complaints and cause disturbance to residents by customers visiting the premises throughout the night and particularly into the early hours of the morning. There is also the likelihood of noise disturbance from deliveries and staff activities.

I will attempt to contact the applicant regarding my concerns and to discuss any possible noise limiting arrangements.

Please give further details of why you believe this application will have an adverse effect on the licensing objectives.

Occupants of adjoining and nearby residential properties could be adversely affected by noise from activity inside the premises, particularly when windows and doors are open.

The premises is a bar and restaurant located on the ground floor of 11 Narborough Road a busy area just outside the city centre in the Westcotes ward. The area consists of a mixture of bars and restaurants, drinking establishments, commercial businesses and residential dwellings.

The premises also holds a current Pavement Cafe Licence LEISC6136.

There are a variety of licensed premises in the vicinity including off licences, late night refreshment premises and bars, many of which are open throughout the nighttime economy.

The proposed area to be licensed is on the ground floor using the front door for both access and egress.

The shop comprises one property as part of a terrace of buildings with other businesses either side, and living accommodation upstairs.

Ms Elizabeth Arculus, Licensing Officer and Miss Minaxi Patel, Licensing Enforcement Officer from the Licensing Team at Leicester City Council visited the premises at 11.00hrs on Tuesday 8th April 2025. Ms Arculus had emailed the applicant Mr Jean Alain Kakmeni several times to request a meeting. As there was no response, Ms Arculus contacted the Designated Premises Supervisor Alvine Kouaya Tchega to arrange the meeting. Mr Kakmeni was asked to attend, but unfortunately Mrs Kouaya Tchega confirmed that Mr Kakmeni was unavailable.

11 Narborough Road falls within a designated Area of Special Interest and Consultation under Leicester City Councils Licensing Policy under Section 8 - [licensing-policy-2022-2027.pdf \(leicester.gov.uk\)](#).

Attempts have not been made to address the policy or any of the general concerns.

It is imperative that all applicants fully consider the environmental factors of the area in which they are applying. Section 182 guidance states that applicants should proactively engage with the responsible authorities to ensure that a premises and their management uphold the licensing objectives.

Mrs Kouaya Tchega was unaware of this policy when it was raised by the Licensing Officer at the start of the meeting.

The purpose of the facility was explained to them. They discussed the general operation of the premises and Mrs Kouaya Tchega was asked to explain some of the methods to counter some of the concerns that they raised.

The application refers to a recent major refurbishment which included some extensive remodelling of the premises and full sound insulation. Leicestershire Police and Licensing Enforcement visited the premises on 20th September 2024 and it was noted that the premises was closed for a major refurbishment. Mr Kakmeni and Mrs Kouaya Tchega were advised by Licensing Enforcement Officers to contact the Licensing Department as a variation would be required due to the change of layout. However, Mrs Kouaya Tchega explained that only planning had been informed about this change. Therefore, a breach of the licence has already taken place.

In addition, a Temporary Event Notice was submitted for 1st December 2024 but was refused by the Licensing Authority as it was a late submission. However a breach of the licence conditions was observed by Licensing Enforcement Officers that evening after 01:00hrs and the applicant was spoken to by the officers at 01:25hrs.

Mrs Kouaya Tchega stated that the premises employed an SIA registered security guard on Friday and Saturday from 22:00hrs to the close time.

The capacity of the venue was discussed, but Mrs Kouaya Tchega was unsure about this. The capacity of the venue is usually decided by the Fire Risk Assessment and when Ms Arculus asked Mrs Kouaya Tchega where the fire risk assessment was, she was unsure as to whether or not they had one.

The premises also did not have a refusals/incident log on the premises or any training records for staff.

There were internal and external CCTV cameras installed at the premises with good coverage.

Mrs Kouaya Tchega understood that staff needed to ask for ID in line with the Challenge 25 procedure, which ID to look for, and how to check it was genuine. However there were no Challenge 25 posters on display at the venue.

The Licensing Authority do have concerns about the premises and the effects the extended hours may have on the local community, both business and residential. This relates to the detail of the operating schedule that has been applied for.

The operating schedule does lay out some of the intentions of the applicant however it is loose in outlining specifically how they would uphold the licensing objectives.

The Licensing Authority believe that the application fails to promote three of the licensing objectives and therefore respectfully requests that the application be refused.

However, if the committee elected to grant the licence, the Licensing Authority respectfully requests that the committee considers attaching the following licence conditions in order to promote the licensing objectives.

Conditions Details:

In order to help the police fighting crime, we have upgraded our CCTV system to an ultimate 4K 30 days recording covering all angle. We currently have a permanent door supervisor Friday and Saturday.

Our Staff are trained to identify and prevent potential issues like signs of intoxication and dealing with disruptive customers CCTV has been installed and maintained to deter crime and provide evidence. In house security personnel with up to date SIA license.

We have fire extinguishers, fire exits, and emergency lighting in place and are regularly Maintained. We have a first aid box in place.

There are measures to ensure the premises do not become overcrowded by insuring head count.

Accessibility:

The premises are accessible for people with disabilities and that emergency exits are unobstructed.

We control noise levels by limiting the decibel of our sound system, to prevent disturbance to residents and neighbours.

Our premises is fully sound proof;

We do our best to ensure the premises and surrounding area are kept clean and free from litter and debris. During busy hours outside we do our best to minimize potential nuisance issues, such as queuing or loitering.

We encourage our customers to park their vehicle on the side street to help the traffic flow around the premises to prevent congestion.

We have robust age verification procedures in place to prevent underage drinking and entry. Children under the age of 18 are NOT allow in our premises after 8pm. before this hour, they can only here under parental supervision.
