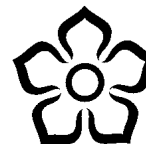

Appendix 1 - Highways Update and Upcoming Works

Action Points from previous meeting:

- Residents reported dangerous speeding on Ratcliffe Road and asked if traffic calming measures can be put in place
 - Traffic calming, as part of the St. Thomas More School Area 20mph Zone has traffic calming (speed cushions) programmed to be installed on Knighton Road & Ratcliffe Road from Tuesday 3rd March to Thursday 19th March (see below)
- Residents reported that cars are parked permanently on Ratcliffe Road, towards Knighton Road end, and have asked if there can be yellow lines.
 - There are double yellow lines at the junction itself, which are enforced. We have added further lining to our Local Environmental Work list and will contact the ward Councillors to see if they wish to pursue this and to what extent.
- Residents reported pavement parking on Queens Road, just beyond Gainsborough Road
 - We believe that this is concerning the Queens Road limited waiting bays. These are on the list sent to be re-lined and will be tackled in the coming financial year.
- Residents reported parking problems in general on Queens Road, with students leaving their cars parked there for long periods of time.
 - The option of the introduction of limited waiting bays can be investigated. We have placed this on our LEW priority and can progress if ward councillors wish.
- Residents requested to know how many FPN had been issued on Northcote Road and Overdale Road.
 - 0 FPN's have been issued on these two roads in the last 12 months. Only 1 observation in 15 visits, but the car moved before being ticketed.
- Reports of speeding along Stoughton Road, especially in the evening
 - Concerns about speeding traffic can be reported to the police via the safety camera web site www.speedorsafety.com using the community page. The road will then be assessed for possible safety camera enforcement using vehicle speed survey data and road traffic injury collision records.

Highways Maintenance Works

We continue to inspect the footways and carriageways around the ward and in the last 6 months have found actionable defects as follows:

- Carriageway - 190 orders
- Footway - 301 orders

Queens Road (junction with Clarendon Park Road) – on site last week, renewing the entire junction with new equipment. Still some work to be done to the advanced cycle lane markings.

Queens Road (junction with Knighton Lane) – works to renewing the entire junction with new equipment have been completed.

Knighton Road (junction with Newmarket Street) – works to renew pedestrian crossing have been completed.

Road Safety Schemes

Queens Road & Northcote Road

The temporary barriers that were installed to treat an overshoot issue have been successful so will have now been replaced by permanent islands (Rubberised) on Wednesday, 25th Feb.

Ratcliffe Road

The St. Thomas More School Area 20mph Zone has traffic calming (speed cushions) programmed to be installed on Knighton Road & Ratcliffe Road from Tuesday 3rd March to Thursday 19th March with the new 20mph Speed Limit starting from Monday 23rd March.

Residents that live within the proposed 20mph Zone are currently being consulted for opinions on this proposal.

Active Travel / School Streets

Stage 2 public consultation on Milford Rd and Craighill Rd to start this week:

- Milford Road is a raised crossing with footway buildout at the junction with Craighill Road. Reconstruction of a section of the road and resurfacing around the junction planned.
- Craighill Road is the replacement of the temporary wooden planters at the existing closure point (just to the north of Milford Road) with two rain gardens and a cycle lane in the centre. Construction programmed to start after Easter weekend.

Our Parking Enforcement team continues to visit schools in the ward, at drop off and pick up times to enforce parking restrictions. Latest visits are:
