Housing Update

We have been working closely with the City Wardens in relation to the fly tipping. All staff have been trained to check fly tipping for evidence and if any is found, we are sending photographs to the City Wardens, who are then inviting all parties in for an interview and issuing fines and a clean up fee. If the perpetrator is an LCC tenant, we enforce the conditions of their tenancy, if they are a Leaseholder, we enforce the conditions of their lease. Can the residents please be provided clear instructions on how to dispose of their rubbish by either visiting one of the tips (permit needed for a van but not for a car)

The tip addresses are:

Gypsum Close, Leicester, LE4 9AB

Islington Street, Freemen's Common, Leicester, LE2 7SQ

Or by booking a bulky waste collection online. 5 large items can be taken for free, or 15 bags of garden waste. Absorbent items must be covered to keep them dry.

- 2. We have been receiving complaints in relation to the overgrowth in the area. Grounds Maintenance are currently six weeks behind schedule due to a backlog. They are working extremely hard to cut back areas that are hazardous or are obstructing roads etc. We appreciate the patience of the residents whilst the team are working to get back on track.
