	▪ The meeting noted a presentation on the issues noted regarding ECO4 GBIS Schemes, on the installation cladding schemes on homes.	

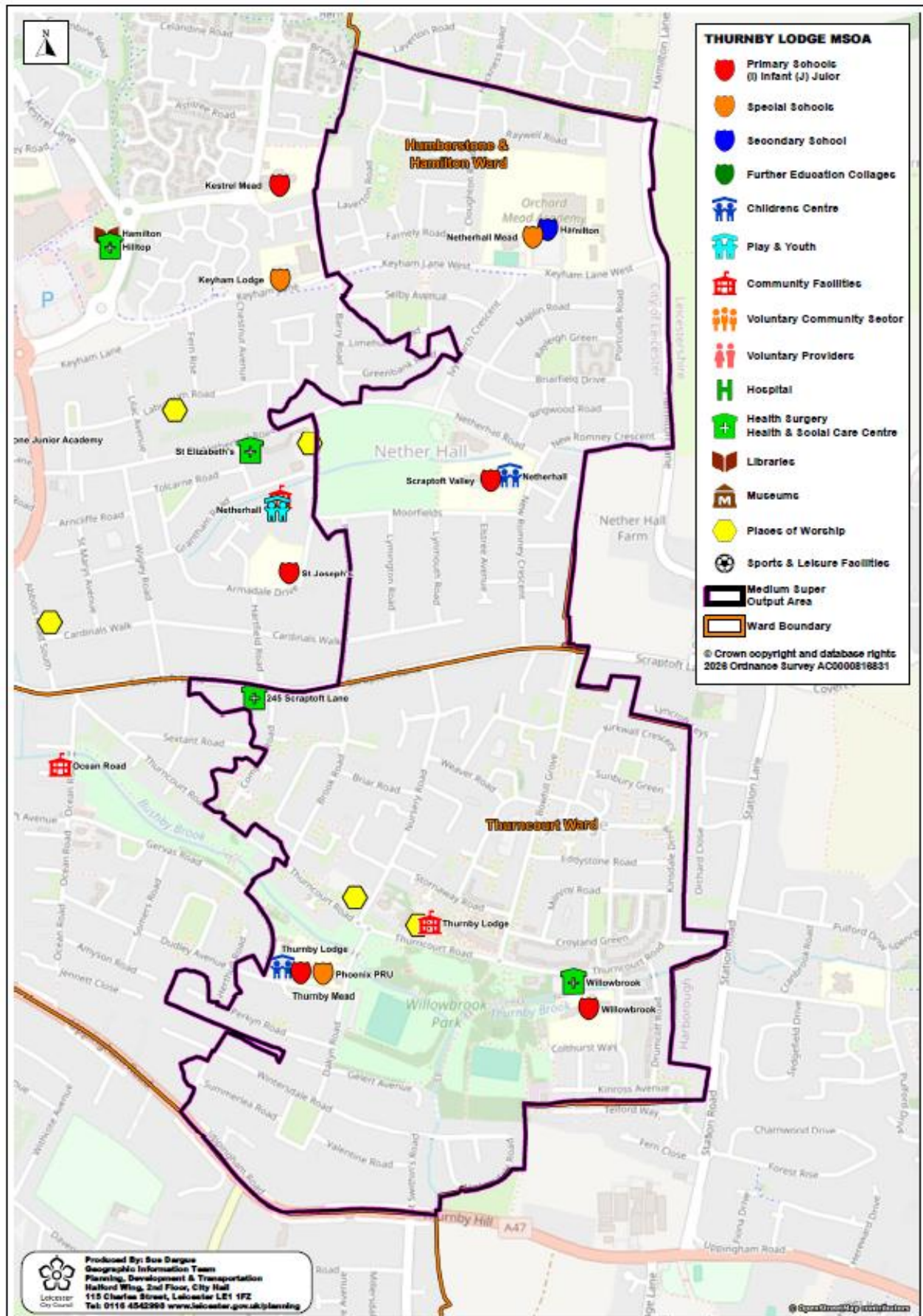
7.	Ward Community Budget

Household Waste Duty of Care

This is to remind residents of your responsibilities for the disposal of the waste from your property. The waste (Household Waste) Duty of Care (England & Wales) Regulations 2005 state that householders are required to take reasonable measures to ensure that their household waste is passed on to an authorised person.

If you wish to use one of the Community Recycling Centres across the City then you must ensure that only the correct waste is deposited, which waste must be placed within the containers. Any waste left outside of containers or on the Highway is considered as Fly-Tipping which is a Criminal Offence under S33 of The Environmental Protection Act 1990.

Leicester City Council also provides a bulky collection service for residents of the city. All householders are entitled to one free collection of up to five items of Bulky material every two months. Householders will be charged for the removal of over five items, and the charge will depend on the number of items collected. This will be advised when the request is made.
