Dear committee chair person / members,

On behalf of my client, I can confirm that the applicant Miss Oana Corbu, would like to take the following steps in order to promote the licensing objectives (set out in section 18 of Appendix A).

"The prospective licence holder will not sell any beers, lagers, ciders or perrys where the alcohol by volume (ABV) exceeds 5.5%"

"The prospective licence holder will ensure that any alcohol on display outside licensable times is not accessible to customers attending the premises and that signs are clearly displayed informing customers the times of which alcohol is available for sale"

"All staff involved in the sale of alcohol will be able to converse with customers and provide advice and assistance in accurate spoken English concerning the lawful sale of alcohol."

"The prospective licence holder will ensure all incidents of Crime which lead to injury, disorder and damage to property are reported to the police and recorded in an incident book to be kept at the premises and made available immediately to Responsible Authorities on request."

Should the committee find it necessary, the above measures can be placed as condition/s along with any amendment to the supply of alcohol times thought by committee upon the new licence?

We trust the above measures will have help to reduce the existing cumulative impact.
