RESOLVED:

- (1) That Cabinet be recommended that for the year 2005/06 the figure of £3million be programmed for 'HomeCome' this being the anticipated figure of commuted sums and in the event this figure is exceeded, the surplus should be awarded to 'HomeCome',
- (2) that Cabinet be informed that Housing Scrutiny Committee support the programme of Bathroom/Kitchen Modernisation but seek assurance that this will be targetted at the elderly in its initial stages,
- (3) that the issue of play equipment in Housing be referred to the Corporate Director of Regeneration and Culture, and
- (4) that Cabinet be informed of the Scrutiny Committee's commitment to the new telephony system be endorsed for 2005/06 as part of the Housing Capital Programme.
