b) Housing Scrutiny Committee - 6 April 2006

Any Other Business - Integrated Services Review

That the Scrutiny Committee submit the following proposals to Cabinet for its consideration:

That Cabinet, with immediate effect, makes a full review of it's decision

to transfer the anti- social behaviour unit from the Housing Department to the Adult and Community Services Department, in view of the fact that Members of the Housing Scrutiny Committee have asked a series of questions in respect of the Unit remaining in the Housing Department. The Housing Scrutiny Committee strongly believe that all aspects of crime and disorder should be contained within the Housing Department on the grounds that over 85% of referrals to the anti-social behaviour come from Housing officers. Furthermore, Members of the Housing Scrutiny Committee were at no point consulted around the transfer of the Unit.
