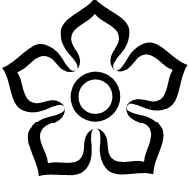

- 1.1. This report provides information for Members about an objection notice received in relation to a temporary event notice (TEN) given under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome.

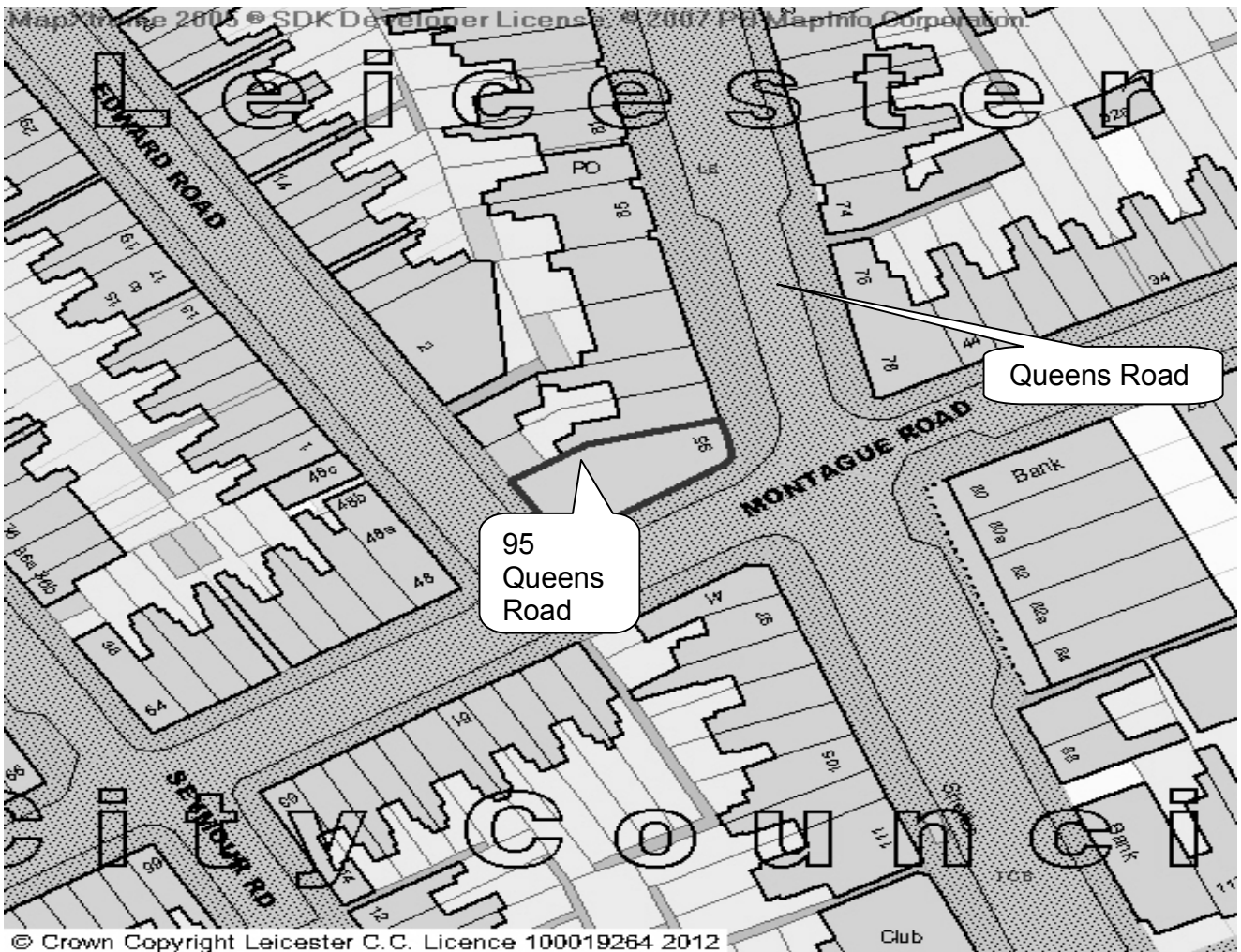
2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the temporary event notice and the objection notice, Members must consider whether to
- Give the premises user a counter notice under Section 105 (2) of the Licensing Act 2003 if it is considered appropriate for the promotion of a licensing objective to do so; or
 - Impose one or more conditions on the temporary event notice if:
 - it is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so, and
 - the condition(s) are also imposed on a premises licence or club premises certificate that has effect in relation to all or part of the same premises as the temporary, and
 - the condition(s) would not be inconsistent with the carrying out of the licensable activities under the temporary event notice; or
 - Disregard the objection notice

3. Summary

- 3.1 This report outlines an objection notice given by the Noise Team in response to a temporary event notice given by Mr. Taylor for Olives Lounge Café Bar. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

5. Temporary event notice

5.1. A temporary event notice was given on 13th March 2015 by Mr. Taylor for an event at Olives Lounge Café Bar, 95 Queens Road. The temporary event notice is for an event on 18th April 2015 and is attached at Appendix A.

5.2. The temporary event notice is for the following licensable activities:

6. Objection notice

6.1 An objection notice was received on 16th March 2015 from the Noise Team on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance. A copy of the objection notice is attached at Appendix B. At the time of the report no agreement has been reached.

7. Existing premises licence

- 7.1 The premises identified in the temporary event notice is fully covered by an existing premises licence. One or more of the conditions on this premises licence may be applied to the temporary event notice if Members consider it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and insofar as the conditions are not inconsistent with the carrying on of licensable activities under the notice. A copy of the existing premises licence, including the conditions are attached at Appendix C.

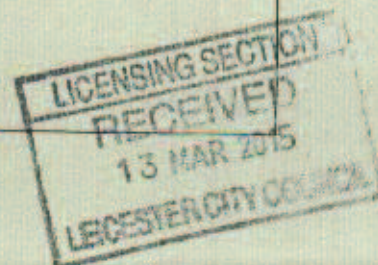



Representation

I wish to make representation in connection with this application for a temporary event notice (TEN) as I consider this proposal will be detrimental to the licensing objective of public nuisance.

REASONS:

Due to the position of the premises, noise from the Olives Lounge Café Bar has the potential to cause noise nuisance to nearby residential premises, Montague Road in particular. The likelihood of a nuisance being caused is even greater in after midnight as the background noise in the area drops significantly.

If the Temporary Event is allowed to on go without any mitigating measures it is likely to result in complaints of noise nuisance.

I recommend that additional conditions currently on the Premises Licence (as detailed below) should be applied to this TEN

CONDITIONS

1. Waste bottles will be disposed of in the morning to avoid any disturbance
2. All windows and doors will remain shut at all times, whatever the season except for access and egress.
3. All ground floor doors to be fixed, except those for entrance / egress. (Note: This relates to the concertina style doors)
4. On occasions when music is played, its noise must not be perceptible from behind any closed door in any nearby residences. In the event of any complaint being received, the licence holder will take immediate steps to stop the noise
5. There will be a daily collection of waste
6. All deliveries to or from the premises, including the collection of waste, will be restricted to between 10.00 and 19.00 hours
7. No rubbish will be left on the public highway
8. Prominent notices of an adequate size and adequately lit, will be displayed inside the premises inviting clients to leave quietly
9. All staff to leave via the Queens Road entrance in a quiet and orderly fashion
10. The shutter on the rear door will be closed quietly

I will make every effort to contact the applicant. If an agreement is reached, I have requested that they contact you in writing. In the absence of such a formal written request being made, I will recommend refusal for this TEN application as it stands.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions**Supply of alcohol - on the premises**

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance or harm to children-

- a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol) or
 - ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
 - i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamourise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

The responsible person shall ensure that-

- a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Supply of alcohol - off the premises

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such

older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

The licence holder will join the Leicester Watch scheme operating in the area and will ensure that all instances of crime and disorder are reported.

The licence holder shall introduce a policy requiring the production of "proof of age" for any sale that takes place where there is any suspicion that the customer is under 18. Such proof may include a pass conforming to the PASS accreditation system, photo driving licence, student cards and passports.

The licence holder will not tolerate drug use at any time.

The licence holder will ensure that alcohol will not be sold to anyone who appears to be drunk and disorderly.

The licence holder will ensure that there is access throughout the premises for disabled customers.

The licence holder will ensure that there is a first aider on the premises at all times.

Children must be under the supervision of parents or guardians at all times.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority

Waste bottles will be disposed of in the morning to avoid any disturbance.

All windows and doors will remain shut at all times, whatever the season except for access and egress.

All ground floor doors to be fixed, except those for entrance / egress. (Note: This relates to the concertina style doors.)

On occasions when music is played, its noise must not be perceptible from behind any closed door in any nearby residences. In the event of any complaint being received, the licence holder will take immediate steps to stop the noise.

There will be a daily collection of waste.

All deliveries to or from the premises, including the collection of waste, will be restricted to between 10.00 and 19.00 hours.

No rubbish will be left on the public highway.

All rubbish will be disposed of in a safe, sealed container (not plastic sacks).

All drinking and eating will be restricted to within the premises.

Prominent notices of an adequate size and adequately lit, will be displayed inside the premises inviting clients to leave quietly.

All staff to leave via the Queens Road entrance in a quiet and orderly fashion.

The shutter on the rear door will be closed quietly.

CCTV will be installed and maintained internally and externally at all times, in accordance with the advice of the Crime Prevention Officer.

Daily checks will be made to the rear of the premises with a view to maintaining cleanliness.

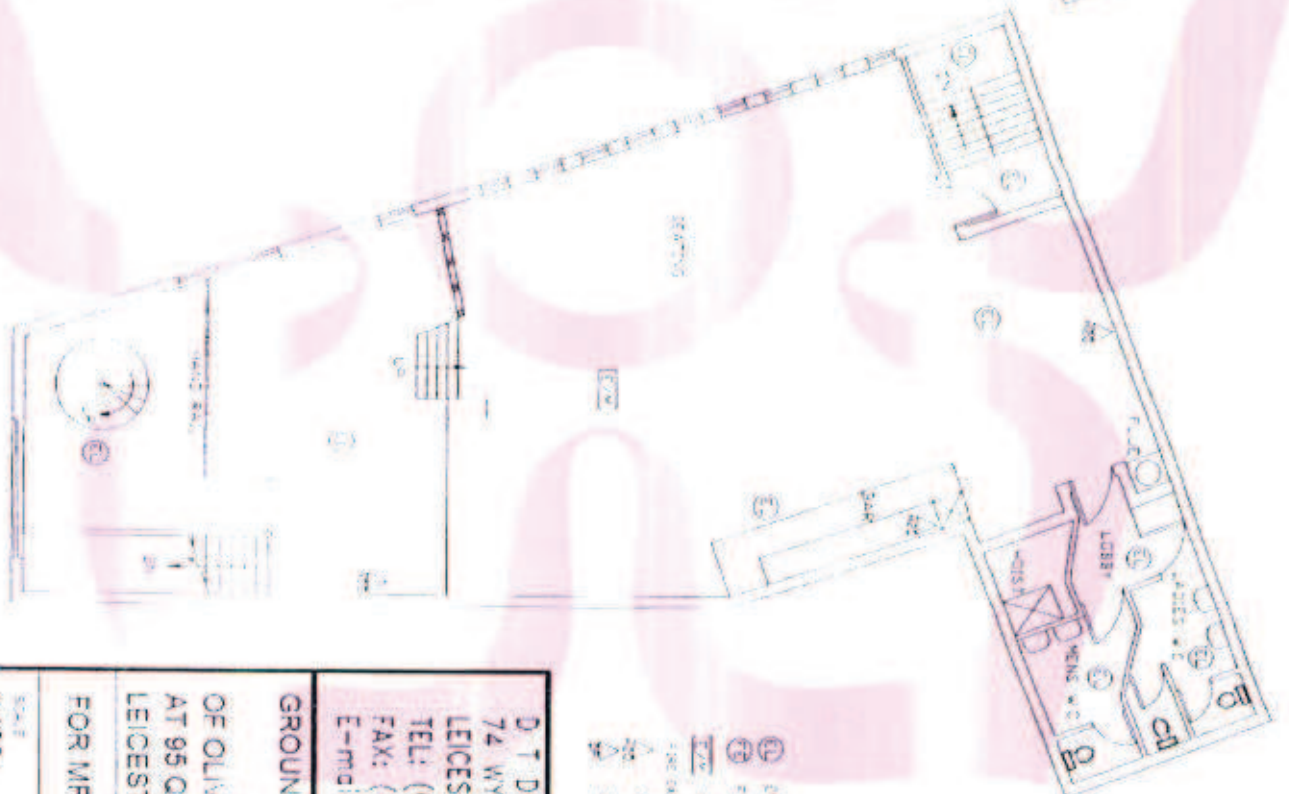
