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## Report of the Corporate Director Adults and Housing

### 1 Purpose of Report

- 1.1 The Adult Skills and Learning Service is dependent on Learning and Skills Council (LSC) funding. Our ESOL provision generates a substantial part of our income from LSC. Over 1,500 people enrol on ESOL courses with the City. ESOL learners are a substantial cohort of our learners across the city. ESOL classes have always been offered free of charge and take-up has been sharp, with demand often outstripping supply.
- 1.2 In its annual statement of priorities, *Raising our Game*, published in October 2006, the LSC says:
  - "From 2007/2008, ESOL learning will no longer attract automatic fee remission. Free tuition will be available only to priority groups primarily people who are unemployed or receiving income-based benefits".
- 1.3 These proposed changes mean that:
  - Existing universal entitlement to free ESOL training up to level 2 is removed
  - Fee remission is available only to people receiving means-tested benefits and tax credits
  - Asylum seekers aged 19+ will no longer be automatically eligible for publicly funded FE provision from 2007/08.
- 1.4 The exact changes to funding have not yet been agreed and various groups, including the City Council are campaigning in an effort to change LSC' direction. A final decision is awaited.
- 1.5 The Cabinet Lead has written letters to:

  - Phil Hope MP, Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State, both at the Department for Education and Science.

- 1.6 Additional work being undertaken by officers at this time includes:
  - collecting and presenting evidence to relevant bodies as to how people living in Leicester may be affected by such changes
  - working closely with LSC in drawing up a schedule as to how to implement any changes
  - assessing the level of fee so as to cause minimum disruption
  - identifying any other possible sources of funding
  - working closely with learners around the introduction of any large-scale changes
  - reviewing our programme offer to meet needs of learners and offer "best value"
