

The Licensing Authority re inspected the above premises and it has been noted that the following breaches of the conditions of your licence have still not been addressed.

The following breaches of conditions were noted and had not been addressed

- 1. The alarm system was still not maintained and remains inactive.
- 2. There had been no attempt to implement Staff training since the previous visit.
- Staff (namely the DPS Iwona WOJCIK) very little knowledge of the Licensing Act 2003 and is still unable to name the main four the licensing objectives

The following breaches of conditions had been addressed:-

- 1. There were Challenge 25 notices clearly displayed.
- 2. Staff had located the refusals book and was now in use it was now situated behind the till/counter area of the shop, for recording any challenges made by Staff.
- 3. Staff (DPS) was now in possession of her personal licences for inspection.
- 4. The emergency exit to the rear of the premises was locked by means of a metal barred gate, which was padlocked and prevented any emergency exit from the premises this was still padlocked but the key was in the padlock and was easily opened if required for an emergency exit.

Please ensure that you comply with the three remaining breaches (detailed above) within 7 (seven) days from the date of this letter. All conditions stated on the licence must be fully complied with under the Licensing Act 2003. Any non-compliance may constitute offences under the law and enforcement action could be taken.

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

I am an officer of HM Revenue and Customs based in Nottingham. On 10th April 2019 at 1730 hours I visited Euromarket, 33 Narborough Road, Leicester, LE3 OLE with HMRC officers Webb, Lee and officers from Leicester Police, Leicester City Council and Leicester Trading Standards.

We identified ourselves to Iwona Wojcik (IW),

acting as cashler in the store, and explained the reason for our visit - to carry out an inspection of the premises in accordance with Section 112 Customs and Excise Management Act 1979. We advised IW that a search dog would be utilised during the inspection. We located quantities of non UK duty paid cigarettes and tobacco inside a blue suitcase and a sports direct bag in a small kitchen room at the rear left hand side of the shop interior. When asked

about these items IW stated she had been selling non UK duty paid cigarettes at £5.00 for a pack of 20 for a few weeks. Further quantities of non UK duty paid tobacco products were identified on a shelf and inside a lollipop container behind the counter in the shop.

At 1832 hours wagtails dog handler and search dog search entered the premises. Dog indications were given in area behind counter and in small kitchen referred to above. At 1845 hours the dog and handler left the shop.

Non UK duty paid goods located inside the store were counted and placed into 36 individually sealed bags.


At 2045 hours 13,040 mixed brands cigarettes plus 3.27 kilos mixed brands hand rolling tobacco were seized under Section 139 Customs and Excise Management Act 1979. Seizure paperwork and Notices were issued to IW. At 2100 hours I left the shop with officers and 36 sealed bags.

I am an officer of Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs (HMRC), working in the Mobile Enforcement Team based in Nottingham.

On the 10th April 2019 at 1900 hours I attended 31 Narborough Road, Leicester with Officers Iqbal, Birkinshaw, and Pawak after being contacted by HMRC officer Lee to assist with positive dog indications at Flat 4 31 Narborough Road, Leicester.

The flat is situated directly above the Euro Market, 33 Narborough Road, Leicester and the stair entrance was to the right hand side of the shop door. The keys for the stairwell were located on the same keyring as the shop keys.

I spoke with cashier Iwona Wojcik

denied any knowledge of a connection between the owner of the Flat

and the Euro Market, but provided the following for the owner of the business giving
the name of Bako and contact number

Senior Investigation Officer Astill authorised the Writ of Assistance at 2000 hours.

The premises were entered by officers at 2002 hours under Section 161A of the Customs and Excise Management (CEMA) Act 1979 using keys from the same key ring as the shop keys. Located in a corner of the bedroom numerous boxes and bags were stacked and contained illicit tobacco goods.

Licensing Act 2003

2003 CHAPTER 17

PART 7

OFFENCES

Smuggled goods

144 Keeping of smuggled goods

- (1) A person to whom subsection (2) applies commits an offence if he knowingly keeps or allows to be kept, on any relevant premises, any goods which have been imported without payment of duty or which have otherwise been unlawfully imported.
- (2) This subsection applies-
 - to any person who works at the premises in a capacity, whether paid or unpaid, which gives him authority to prevent the keeping of the goods on the premises,
 - (b) in the case of licensed premises, to-
 - (i) the holder of a premises licence in respect of the premises, and
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) under such a licence,
 - (c) in the case of premises in respect of which a club premises certificate has effect, to any member or officer of the club which holds the certificate who is present on the premises at any time when the goods are kept on the premises in a capacity which enables him to prevent them being so kept, and
 - (d) in the case of premises which may be used for a permitted temporary activity by virtue of Part 5, to the premises user in relation to the temporary event notice in question.
- (3) A person guilty of an offence under this section is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale.
- (4) The court by which a person is convicted of an offence under this section may order the goods in question, and any container for them, to be forfeited and either destroyed or dealt with in such other manner as the court may order.
