78. REPORT ON THE INSPECTION OF PRIVATE FOSTERING BY THE COMMISISON FOR SOCIAL CARE INSPECTION

A report of the Corporate Director of Children and Young People was considered which advised Members of the outcome of the inspection of the private fostering service which took place in September 2006. It was noted that there was no specific City private fostering service so the inspection had looked at the Council's overall arrangements. The outcome of the inspection had been positive with six of the seven standards met and one nearly met. It was noted that the Council had now introduced new arrangements for private fostering and so the inspection related to the previous arrangements.

Members acknowledged the difficulty of this area of work and suggested that it would be something the Committee would need to further consider. However concern was expressed that the standard not fully met related to safeguarding. It was noted that the issue related to an inadequate assessment of risk in two of the cases the inspectors had looked at. Since the inspection all cases had been audited and appropriate measures were in the process of being fully implemented.

Members noted that the report referred to potential additional resource requirements. It was noted by officers that the recommendations of the inspection would be implemented by using existing revenue budgets.

RESOLVED:

- 1. That the Scrutiny Committee note the content of the Commission for Social Care Inspection report of the private fostering arrangements and the overall positive outcome of this inspection;
- 2. That staff are commended for their hard work and contribution to the report; and
