This statement (consisting of 1 page(s) each signed by me) is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be false, or do not believe to be true.

I am Police Sergeant 541 Wells of Leicestershire Police currently based at Mansfield House police station. I am a neighbourhood policing Sergeant and have responsibility for the City Centre beat and for licensing.

I provide this statement in relation to a proposed 3-day event known as the Beyond Festival that if granted will be held on Abbey Park. The proposed location is situated a short walk from the city centre as such I believe that if held the event will have a significant impact on the city.

I understand that the event is due to be held at the end of June with it due to end around 2245 hrs. Following the event ending it is highly likely we will see a large influx of intoxicated people heading to the city centre and adding to those who are already part of the night time economy and subsequently increasing the incidents that occur within the city centre.

Up to 10,000 people could attend each day, this is a significant number of people and I would expect that a good proportion will go onto come into an already busy city centre night time economy environment. The additional numbers will put a strain on licensed premises and the emergency services as we know from reviewing incidents that wherever there is a large concentration of intoxicated people calls for service to the ambulance service and police increase.

There is already a Public Spaces Protection Order in place in the city centre due to ongoing issues with anti-social behaviour fuelled by alcohol and psychoactive substances. Due to the nature of the festival it can be presumed that many of the attendees will be consuming alcohol and this, mixed with an influx of crowds into the city at night-time, will likely lead to more instances of anti-social behaviour and in some cases, violent crime, as there has been a long-established link between violence and alcohol.

Due to the time of year the hotter weather may encourage attendees to congregate in outdoor spaces in the city again putting strain on emergency services when tensions arise due to alcohol-fuelled incidents. Owing to the time of year it is anticipated this weekend will already be a busy night time economy and stretch police resources.

The city centre is home to numerous residential flats, houses, and student accommodation an influx of crowds into the city will only serve to cause issues for these residents who already have to live with a standard of disorder entwined with city nightlife.

I would be grateful if the panel could consider the above when deciding on whether to grant a licence.

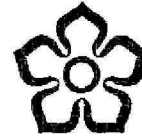

Your attention is drawn to Section 57 of the Licensing Act 2003, which states;

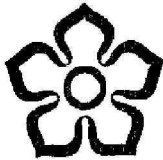

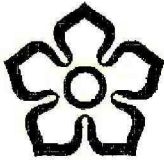

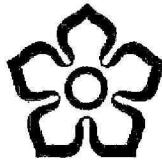

ANNEXES**Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions**

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

- a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supplied alcohol), or
 - ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

- a) a holographic mark, or
- b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person shall ensure that-

- a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

The licence is subject to permission being granted by the land/building/area owner for specific use of any event/s planned. This must be evidenced in writing upon request by the Licensing Authority. The Licence Holder will comply with any local policies or regulations that relate to that land/building/area.

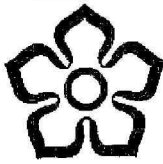

The licence is subject to the licence holder satisfying the deadlines set in relation to submission of any event plans, risk assessments or any other documents or plans required by the Authorities/Agencies as detailed within permission letter issued by the Local Authority. If these deadlines are not adhered to satisfactorily as deemed by the Licensing Authority, the licence is deemed null and void and all licensable activities will not be licensed.

The licence holder must submit a fully documented event management plan to the Festivals & Events team which must be completed within the agreed timelines. The plan must include full details relating to at the very least; event management structure and contact details, site plans, programme timings, attendance estimations, site, staging and facilities provisions, Emergency risk assessments and access, public communications, insurances and any other areas of consideration. Consultation must take place between the licence holder and the Festivals & Events team to achieve this and will be adhered to in full.

The Licensing Authority will consult with all the required authorities/agencies to ensure that all the conditions are complied with in full and inform the licence holder if this is not the case which will require immediate compliance and if not the condition/s relating to deadlines will come into force.

The time restrictions of activities stated on the licence are the maximum allowed, however the time limits stated within the event management plan or risk assessments would be those applicable.

The licence holder will comply with all reasonable actions or steps directed by or an officer acting on behalf of the Licensing Authority.

The licence holder will consult with the police in relation to any event/s where this licence will be in use.

The licence holder will submit to Leicestershire Police (Operations planning department or as directed) any documents that they require as part of a documented plan or risk assessment that must be submitted in line with agreed deadlines.

The licence holder will complete any reasonable requests or instructions issued by the police in relation to the event/s.

Full consideration and assessment must take place of the security provision. This must be done in consultation with the police, Festivals & Events Team and the Licensing Authority. The authorities must be satisfied that the provisions are in place, meet the requirements of any event/s and will be adhered to in full.

Any personnel that require to be SIA registered must be correctly licensed and must display their SIA identification prominently at all times during any event/s.

The Licence Holder must ensure that all staff (paid or unpaid) selling alcohol are trained on the law with regards to age restricted sales, in particular what identification can be accepted and that this is properly documented. A comprehensive noise risk assessment must be completed in consultation with the noise pollution team of the local authority. The authority must be satisfied with this assessment and that it will be adhered to in full.

The licence holder will take all reasonable steps in order to reduce the chances of any event causing a public nuisance.

The licence holder will monitor and not exceed the maximum safe capacity for any event. This will be determined by the local authority in consultation with partner agencies and detailed on the event management plan.

The licence holder will take into account public safety in all aspects of any events and this must be documented within the event management plan and any other risk assessments or documents submitted to the satisfaction of the relevant part of the local authority.

The licence holder will consult and comply with any required public safety actions directed by the relevant parts of the local authority.

The licence holder will consult with the Traffic Management/Highways or relevant parts of the local authority if required and submit a management plan in relation to traffic/highways management. This must be to the satisfaction of the local authority and complied with in full.

If alcohol is being served or sold, then the age verification scheme 'Challenge 25' must be operated and complied with by all staff members. Staff members must be trained in the scheme and specifically what identification can be accepted. Notices advertising that the premises operates a Challenge 25 scheme must be displayed in a clear and prominent position at the entrance to the event and inside the event at all bar serving areas where alcohol is being served or sold.

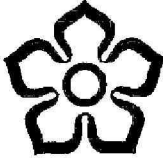

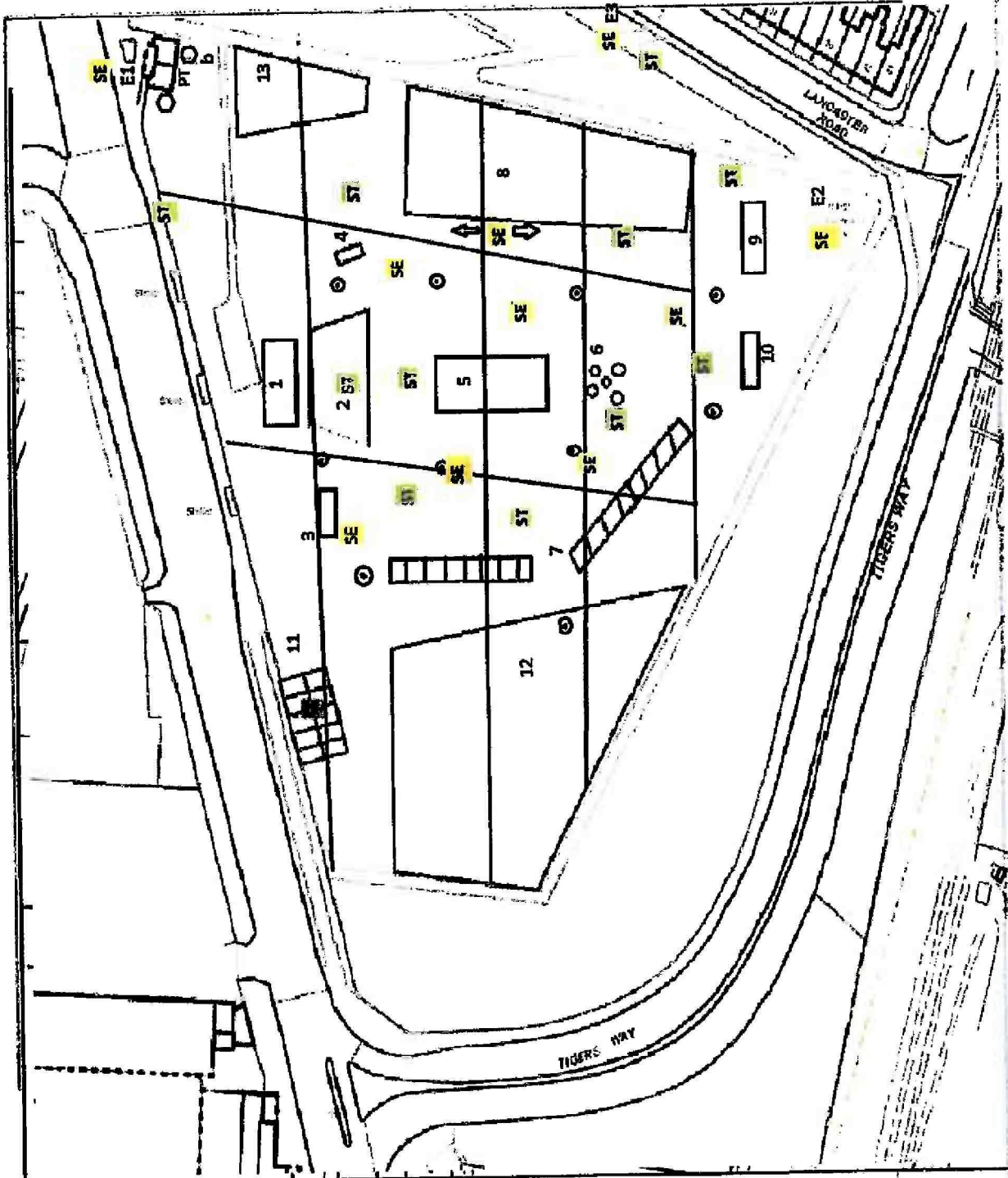
