I am and I am the licence holder of street trading licence for Boston road since 2007 with licence number LEISTC0036. Last year I made another application on the renewal time (August) of my licence and I moved my cob van to corner of Boston Road/Sheene Road. I got my new licence and number is LEISTC0528.

I found out that a new street trading application made for Boston Road alongside Marks Electrical.

I would like to object to application as it would be unfair to me if council grants the application. Because I am trading in the industrial estate since 2007 and I have goodwill in there. A new cob van will be a competitor to me and the estate is not big, as it only has Boston road and Sheene road. So the estate does not need one more cob van. Also Marks Electrical is approximately 50 meters away from my cob van.

Beaumont Leys shopping centre is in the walking distance as some people choose to go there as there are more options in there such as Greggs, Subway, Costa, Mc Donalds, Fish Shop etc... In addition, Jiffy Vans from Britannia and Mc Gorum's they visit the estate in the morning and afternoon and they sound the chimes and they do sales in estate.

Since the big companies with lots of staff, closed down in the estate such as Mark Group and Artisan Printing, it did affect my business badly, and when corona hit the whole world in 2020 that affected my business terribly. As we reopened, I am trying my best to keep my business to survive. As I mentioned earlier a competition will not help at all, while there is already a competition in place.(B.Leys shopping centre and Britannia and Mc Gorum Jiffy Vans)

I was on Boston road from 2007 until last year and I am off the road now which helps the traffic in the estate as people parking their cars and vans on the road it is always usual to see traffic jam in the estate especially when artic lorries make manoeuvres/turns. Another cob van on Boston Road will cause more traffic in the estate.
