I am a local resident and I am very concerned about the proposal for a license being granted to Aspire Learning partnerships for activities and events being held at the City of Leicester school. If the events are in the school premises during school time that is acceptable.

If it anything outside of normal school hours that would increase the traffic noise and pollution, we already have endured and suffer from.

The prospect of having live bands and music performances up until 11pm from Monday- Sunday has increased my anxiety levels greatly and quite frankly fills me with dread. There are enough venues around the City that can provide venues for bands to play live music such as Victoria Park, Demontfort Hall etc.. we already have enough noise pollution in this area from all the school traffic so we do not need additional noise pollution from live music. The City of Leicester School is a School the Residents that live close by, including myself do not want it turning into a music venue outside of school hours.

This is a quiet residential area which is not only damaged by the pollution during school drop off and pick up but also from the countless daily activities which run from 5pm - 7pm the school premises are used for. There seems to be no time in the day in this area where there is no traffic pollution. The after-school activities have hundreds of cars coming to the area when it is bad enough during school times.

Has there been an environmental impact of all the pollution caused by traffic generated from the school traffic as well as the daily after school community venue hire activities which are not for local residents or the school children. There are three secondary schools all within walking distance and three primary schools. That creates a horrendous amount of traffic in a conservation area.

I think Evington Village is conservation area. The health's of residents in this area are being seriously negatively impacted with higher prevalence of COPD and CVD in Leicester which are conditions made worse through pollution. If people and parents are asked to take public transportation then to come into school or these events then that would be acceptable and reduce the negative impact. If not, this just adds to the congestion and pollution. If we are serious about the climate crisis and the health of our children this application should only be approved with Strict conditions.

I therefore, like many others who live in this area, do not support the application by Aspire learning Partnership.
