On Wednesday April 17 together with my client we had an appointment with Paul Hardwick (police officer) and Elizabeth Arculus (enforcement officer) at the premises in order to discuss the new application.

In view of the concern shown by the email sent to your office from a Councillor, we had to talk about the range of beers, lagers and ciders to be stocked.

Both Officers were of the opinion that it was not necessary to propose maximum abv limits as conditions. There was no evidence of problems in this area of London Road  
My client stated that it was not his intention to attract “street drinkers” and relied on his previous experience to act accordingly.

We rely on the reports from both Officers to confirm the reluctance to be bound to any restrictive conditions
