74. BELGRAVE CORRIDOR PROJECT

The Director of Environment, Development and Commercial Services submitted a report that proposed a new plan for this project, following consultations and discussions with local people and discussions with the County Council. The plan met the needs of the Belgrave are and delivered key local transport plan objectives.

Councillors Chohan and Mrs. Sood attended the meeting and stated that they had been approached by a number of traders on Belgrave Road who were still unhappy at certain proposals contained in the report and had suggested further consultation with the officers prior to the report being presented to Cabinet.

The Scrutiny Committee were of the opinion, having considered the report and the verbal update from officers, that adequate consultation had already taken place with representatives of the Belgrave community, outlining the Council's proposals regarding the next phase of the Belgrave Corridor Project. However, the Director of Environment, Development and Commercial Services suggested that he meet with the Ward Councillors, prior to the report being considered by Cabinet, to try and address the outstanding concerns of the Belgrave Road traders.

The Scrutiny Committee had no further comments to make on the proposals outlined in the report.
