Forum for Older People - Overview and Progress Report

Report of Service Director, Older People, Social Care and Health

1. Purpose of Report

- 1.1 This report details the work both of the Forum for Older People (FOP) Steering Group and Consultative Group since their inaugural meetings in August 2001.
- 1.2 The report highlights for Members the key issues raised at the Forum by older people and Members and seeks Directorates' increased support to achieve tangible outcomes for the benefit of older residents in the City.
- 1.3 The report includes amendments and proposals arising from the Forum's Steering Group on 10 July 2002 concerning the future programme for the Forum.

2. Summary

- 2.1 In the last year, presentations from Council departments and external partners, mainly the NHS, (UHL Trust and PCTs) have sought to appraise and consult participants on key strategic developments.
- 2.2 Members of the FOP steering group have also visited sites where services are provided to older people either directly or on behalf of the Council.
- 2.3 It should be noted that the awareness raising 'Grey Matters Event' and general publicity and interest in the work of the Forum has been well received and should be viewed as an area of achievement.
- 2.4 Services for older people are shaped by the National Service Framework (NSF) for Older People, to further support and improve outcomes. It has been agreed that the Council, with health and voluntary sector partners will establish a City Older People's Partnership Board (OPPB) in the Autumn to complete the joint planning arrangements between the Council and the NHS.

3. Recommendations

3.1 Cabinet is asked to:

- (a) note that the Social Services and Personal Health Scrutiny Committee, at its meeting on 16 September, congratulated the Forum on its achievements to date and supported the formation of the Older People's Partnership Board, if the Forum was supportive of it. The Committee also supported the requirement on Directorates to specifically address the needs of older people/people on low incomes in all aspects of policy and as part of the corporate report format;
- (b) note the contents of this report; and
- (c) consider those matters it would wish to follow up and receive further reports on.

4. Financial and legal Implications

- 4.1 There are no specific financial implications arising from this report. The FOP has a budget of £4,500 and has kept to budget. Further detailed work will need to be undertaken to identify funding streams specifically dedicated to the delivery of older people's services as part of the planning processes.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

1. Report

- 1.1 The FOP was established in August 2001 and in this time both the FOP Steering Group and Consultative Group have received a number of presentations from both internal, Council staff and external partners, primarily health.
- 1.2 These presentations have identified areas of development in health and social care, position statements from each department on services for older people and sought the views of members in both meetings on the evolving agenda which impacts on older people's services.
- 1.3 Appendices 1 and 2 detail the subjects covered at each meeting of the FOP Steering Group and Consultative Group.
- 1.4 Significant achievements arising from the FOP include;
 - the Cabinet Lead for Social Care & Health introducing a corporate requirement on all Council Committee papers detailing the implications for elderly people on low income
 - 'Grey Matters' event held on 10 April 2002
 - seeking public representatives from the FOP to sit on the Mental Health Older People Forum

1.6 Attendance

On average at Consultative FOPs there are;

- 6 Elected Members
- 6 Officers
- 20 30 representatives of older people organisations and members of the public
- 2 3 co-opted members (PCT/Health Authorities)
- 1.7 Attendance and presentation by officers from Directorates has been variable, particularly at the steering group. Officers need to ensure that they have a mandate to represent all aspects of their Directorate's work with and for older people and provide regular feedback reports to Directorates.

Venue

1.8 All meetings of the consultative FOP have taken place in the Committee Room and following consultation and sound system improvements, a preferred layout has been agreed.

1.9 Media/Communication

In the past 11 months there has been good interest and coverage in the media. Councillors Swift, Chohan and Getliffe have provided radio interviews in support of the Forum. Articles in the Mercury and Link have also advised members of the public of the dates for meetings and topics for discussion.

- 1.10 Further work will need to be undertaken with health colleagues to keep up the momentum and it is envisaged that 'Older People's Listening Month' in September will play a key part.
- 1.11 The introduction of a specific question and answer format has been well received at the consultative FOP and is noted in the minutes.
