Cluster Business Plans for Youth Work

Planning Overview

All 8 clusters were asked to produce Youth Work Plans for the cluster area as a whole against a planning specification produced by the Principal Youth Officer and discussed with SCLMs and CLMs at an Extended Management Team Meeting.

The plans needed to:

1. Reflect the Division's strategic objectives, as described below:

- To widen participation in learning and community development
- To raise standards of achievement through learning
- To improve the leadership and management of learning in the city

2. Describe processes used and conclusions reached in relation to:

- Determining and interpreting need
- Planning for delivery against need and targets (see Strategic Community Learning Plan for targets)
- Deployment of existing resources and acquisition of any additional resources
- Assuring and improving quality

3. Describe staff's roles and relationship and in particular:

- One CLM per cluster to take the lead for support and development of Youth Work and to be involved in Self Assessment development
- Youth workers operating as a team across each cluster with the team having responsibility for the achievement of key tasks described earlier
- Staff identified to engage in targeted school-based provision for young people at risk of exclusion
- Staff identified to take on a small Personal Adviser caseload
- A specialist role / support for Curriculum Development (with part-time staff in particular)
- A specialist role / support for Staff Development (with part-time staff in particular)
- A specialist role / support for Youth Achievement Award development (accreditation)
- A specialist role / support for Developing the Voice of Young People projects
- Clarity of line-management arrangements for Detached Youth work across cluster
- Identify Youth Workers (16) to be involved in 5 day management training (notionally 2 per cluster but some have more workers than others)

4. Set out the Cluster Plan in the context of the cluster's total youth work budget and explain its allocation to the Plan.

5. Set out the local response to increasing the participation of priority groups

6. Identifying staff training needs.
