Biodiversity in Leicester: Supplementary Planning Guidance

Report of the Service Planning and Sustainable Development

1. Purpose of Report

This report presents the final draft of the *Biodiversity in Leicester* - *Supplementary Planning Guidance*. This sets out the key principles and requirements that should be applied to all new development which could affect the biodiversity of Leicester.

2. Summary

Biodiversity in Leicester - Supplementary Planning Guidance explains why biodiversity is important to Leicester and to the people who live and work in the City, and describes the role that planning process can play in protecting and enhancing the natural resources of the City. It will guide the implementation of the nature conservation polices in the Replacement City of Leicester Local Plan and describes the rationale for these policies.

A wide range of external organisations and individuals have been consulted on the draft Supplementary Planning Guidance, including statutory agencies, neighbouring planning authorities, environmental groups and voluntary organisations, landowners of nature conservation sites and statutory undertakers. Their comments have been incorporated into the final draft.

3. Recommendations

Members are recommended to adopt 'Biodiversity in Leicester' as Supplementary Planning Guidance to the City of Leicester Local Plan.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

1. Biodiversity in Leicester - Supplementary Planning Guidance

- 1.1 The Supplementary Planning Guidance is in two parts. The first part (Chapters 1 5) covers the protection and enhancement of important sites, species and habitats within the City. The second part consists of Appendices which provide the underpinning local and regional context for this guidance.
- 1.2 Chapter 2 considers the protection and enhancement of designated nature conservation sites. National statutory designations (Sites of Special Scientific Interest SSSIs) and local non-statutory designations (Sites of Importance for Nature Conservation, Local Nature Reserves, Biodiversity Enhancement Sites SINCs, LNRs and BESs) are described, and the relative importance and purpose of these designations is summarised.
- 1.3 Chapter 3 covers the conservation of protected species and other species of importance, such as Great Crested Newts, Bats and Badgers.
- 1.4 Chapter 4 provides information on the conservation and potential for enhancement of important wildlife habitats within the City, such as hedgerows, mature trees, standing dead-wood habitats, wetlands and woodlands.
- 1.5 Details of the nature of developer obligations that may be required for developments which affect the above sites, species and habitats are given in Chapter 5, and guidance on enhancing biodiversity on specific sites is given in Appendix 7.
