#### 25. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

## 36. CONSUMER PROTECTION SERVICE PLAN

The Director of Environment, Regeneration and Development presented a report introducing the 2003/04 Service Plan for Consumer protection. It was explained that the Governments National Performance Framework for Trading Standards required the Council to produce a member endorsed service plan for business regulation and consumer protection. The key areas that the plan covered were counterfeiting, builders taking advantage of vulnerable members of the public, advice to businesses, monitoring the sale of age restricted products and equality issues. The various strategies and plans in place to tackle these issues were briefly outlined.

Members expressed support for the plans and its aims. They asked for details of how the authority had been tackling Leicester's reputation as a centre for counterfeiting and also about any plans to tackle the import and sale of illegal tobacco.

The Director of Environment, Regeneration and Development explained that the number of complaints about counterfeiting of branded products had fallen significantly and that Leicester no longer suffered as much with a reputation as a centre for counterfeiting. This had been as a result of the enforcement work that the authority had undertaken and that counterfeiting was now cheaper to undertake elsewhere. There would now be a concentration of targeting counterfeiting of media, such as DVD's. It was reported that the enforcement work for tackling illegal tobacco was largely undertaken by Customs and Excise.
