1.1. Background

- 1.1.1. The report recommends the release of funds allocated in the Capital Programme in the sum of £300,000 for Central Maintenance Fund works.
- 1.1.2. A programme of works, based on identified priorities in relation to water hygiene (one of the main programmes to address health and safety issues in the CMF) has now been developed.
- 1.1.3. With respect to water hygiene rectification works, Priority 1 and 2 items amount to £300,000 and these will be undertaken in the current financial year from this funding. The schemes identified as priority 1 and 2 are detailed in Appendix 1
