## 97. EDUCATION CAPITAL STRATEGY AND PROGRAMME 2005/06 TO 2007/08

The Corporate Director, Education and Lifelong Learning submitted a report which advised Members of the strategic challenges facing the Education and Lifelong Learning property portfolio and the sources of funding available with a view to prioritising available resources. It was stated that while issues had been highlighted about the initial bids it had been a tremendous achievement for the City to win funding for new schools. A further bid had been submitted to government for rebuilding Taylor Primary School and a decision was awaited.

The situation in relation to Western Park school was queried. In reply it was stated that an investigation on options was currently under way and that the matter would be reported to a future scrutiny committee. Mr Flack reminded Members that there was a long-standing undertaking from Members that proceeds from the sale of closed special schools would be ring-fenced to meet the future needs of that service. In the meantime officers would welcome members views on the options.
