

Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exits / in designated smoking areas requesting customers and staff respect the needs of local residents by keeping noise to a minimum when using the outside area and when leaving the premises. We wish to strongly object to the above licencing application for the provision of regulated entertainment, late night refreshments and the supply of alcohol to the above premises.

In the completed application form, it states that they must advertise this application. It has been in the Leicester Mercury on two nights (Monday, 2nd June and Thursday, 5th June) and nowhere else. Surely it should have been put up locally around so that the residents could read this application. The application for the BMX track has been there for all to see. **Not so with this!** I am sure that there are residents who know nothing about this.

We live approximately 500 yards from the clubhouse overlooking the school playing field which will be opening in September as Ellesmere College. I object to alcohol being sold or consumed on school premises which is what the playing field still is.

The noise until 02.00 would keep residents awake and would be a complete nuisance with the parking facilities. All around the clubhouse and football pitches there are houses. We have many cars parking on Harefield Avenue now, just when they are using the football pitch and not legally at the moment. They have cut the gate and padlock to get in. They park on the pavement and an emergency vehicle would not be able to get past if they were there. We have trouble getting past them now.

We all have a basic human right to sleep and I feel that 02.00 is much too late! The lights go off at 22.00 and this is fine. We have to turn our television up when they are playing a match because of all the shouting and swearing! These are grown men and are loud. Tonight, they are playing on the playing fields as the football pitches are full. Behind our garden! It seems that they are over booking the pitches.

In the application form it says that it is going to be open 24 hours a day. Is this possible? Late night refreshments until 02.00 surely means eating and drinking outside the clubhouse until early morning? This will mean more litter. It is bad enough now for what mess they leave about.

Who do we contact should there be any problems? Should we ring the police or will one of you give us your contact number because you can walk away from it all after your decision. We can not!

Surely it was not given a grant to be used as licenced premises! Is this supposed to be a money making business or a community football club. We were told when the plans were announced, that it would be just for football and there would be security in place with frequent checks by security men. No dance or music or films or alcohol was mentioned!


We both strongly object to granting this application.




This strategy was part funded by NHS Leicester City. Would they be concerned to know that this public money was helping to fund licenced premises?

 The clubhouse is situated within the grounds of Ellesmere College and was promoted as being a shared facility with the college. Licenced activities during the school day are inappropriate.

- 4. Both partner clubs GNG and Leicester Ladies run extensive teams and training sessions aimed at youngsters from 4 years of age. I consider it inappropriate to have licenced activities in the presence of young children.
- 5. The site lies in close proximity to a Local Nature Reserve and late night
- activities with noise, traffic and lights would disturb the habitats of local wildlife. 6. This is a residential area and close to the residents of Braunstone Lane East and Amy Street. This has the potential of causing late night noise and traffic, and would be detrimental to their amenities. I therefor object to this licence being granted



The Licence application is contrary to the conditions set out in Condition 4 of the Planning Permission 2011654 dated 16th November 2011 which states that 'there shall be no live or amplified music or voice played which would be detrimental to the amenities of occupiers of nearby properties (in the interests of amenities of nearby occupiers, and in accordance with policy PS10 of the City of Leicester Local Plan).

Likewise, Condition 3 of the planning permission states that the clubhouse should not be used outside the hours of 0700 to 2300 daily. The Town Council therefore strongly objects to the proposed increased hours to 0200 hours.

The Town Council strongly objects to the proposed provision of late night refreshments and alcohol outdoors from the premises, again between the hours of 0900 to 0200 in the interests of the amenities of occupiers of nearby premises as and when they arise.

- The proximity of the area to a local nature reserve: this an area for quiet enjoyment by the public and for the protection and enhancement of the natural world. Loud noise, car traffic, people and lights, particularly at night, has the potential to disturb the species and habitats in the area.
- The football development, as well as being used by adult football clubs, is widely used by children as
 part of the City Council/NHS strategy to encourage sport and fitness in young people. It seems highly
 young people, an alcohol licence (particularly one which allows such extended drinking hours) is granted
- The clubhouse is on the premises of a school. A licence on such premises seems totally inappropriate, particularly since licenced activities could take place within the school day.
- The additional traffic, lighting and noise will prove a detriment to local residents, particularly since the licence has the potential to apply until 2 a.m. This means that there will be disturbance until at least 2.30 – highly inappropriate.

On these grounds Aylestone Meadows Appreciation Society objects to a licence being granted.
