Report of the Director of Environmental Services

1. Purpose of Report

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.


2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the application and representations, Members must consider whether to
 - Grant the licence without modification
 - Grant the licence subject to conditions
 - Exclude from the licence any of the licensable activities
 - Refuse to accept the proposed premises supervisor
 - Reject the application

3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a new premises licence for The Avenue and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

5. Application

5.1 An application was received on 30th May 2014 from Kullar Licence (UK) Ltd for a new premises licence for The Avenue. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.

6. Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

- 6.1 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section M of Appendix A).
- 6.2 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

7 Live Music

- 7.1 The Live Music Act 2012 has amended the Licensing Act 2003 in relation to the provision of live music. Unamplified live music does not require a licence between 08.00 and 23.00 hours each day. Amplified music may be provided between 08.00 and 23.00 hour each day if:
 - it is provided in a premises licensed and open for the sale of alcohol, to an audience of not more than 200 people; or
 - it is provided in a premises that is not licensed under the Licensing Act 2003 (other than solely for late night refreshment) but that is a workplace, to an audience of not more than 200 people.
- 7.2 The above exemptions may affect the application under consideration because conditions may not be imposed at this stage to control live music provided in the circumstances described above. However, if problems do occur as a result of live music then conditions may be imposed to control that music following the formal review process.

8 Representation

- 8.1 A representation was received on 10th June 2014 from the Noise Team. The representation relates to the prevention of public nuisance. The Noise Officer is concerned that the premises is closely bordered by residential properties and the use of the premises until 00.30 hours seven days a week may cause disturbances to local residents. The Noise Team have sought an agreement with the applicant. A copy of this and the representation are attached at Appendix B1.
- 8.2 A representation was received on 20th June 2014 from Leicestershire Police. The representation relates to the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and the prevention of public nuisance. Leicestershire Police are concerned that this premises had its premises licence revoked 28th March 2014 after the review application in October 2013. If this premises is licensed without strict conditions, the problems that instigated the review may re-occur. Leicestershire Police have sought an agreement with the applicant. A copy of this and the representation are attached at Appendix B2.
- 8.3 A representation was received on 26th June 2014 from a local resident. The representation relates to the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and the prevention of public nuisance. The resident is concerned that due to the close proximity the premises has to local residential properties, there will be disturbances from people using the decking at the front of the premises and the potential for anti-social behaviour. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix B3.

9 Conditions

9.1 The conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule and the representation are attached at Appendix C.

10. Statutory Guidance
