Application for a new premises licence General Store, 44 Beaconsfield Road, Leicester LE3 0FE

Report of the Director of Environmental and Enforcement Services

1. Purpose of Report

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.


2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the application and representations, Members must consider whether to
 - Grant the licence without modification
 - Grant the licence subject to conditions
 - Refuse to accept the proposed premises supervisor
 - Reject the application

3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a new premises licence for a General Store, 44 Beaconsfield Road, Leicester LE3 0FE and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

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5. Application

- 5.1. An application was received on 18 August 2014 from Mr Arshad Aziz for a new premises licence for a general store at 44 Beaconsfield Road, Leicester. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.
- 5.2 The hours sought by the application are as follows:

Supply of Alcohol (off sales)	Monday to Saturday 8am – midnight
	Sunday 9am – 10pm
Opening hours	Monday to Saturday 8am – midnight
	Sunday 9am – 10pm

6. Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

- 6.1 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section P of Appendix A).
- 6.2 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

7. Representations

- 7.1 A representation was received on 28 August 2014 from Councillor Russell. The representation relates to the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance. Councillor Russell is concerned that granting the licence will lead to an increase in anti-social behaviour, street drinking and disturbances particularly with the late hours sought. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix B1.
- 7.2 A representation was received on 9 September 2014 from a local resident. The representation relates to the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance. The resident is concerned that granting the licence will lead to an increase in anti-social behaviour, street drinking and disturbances. This representation is in the form of a letter supported by a petition signed by 56 residents. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix B2.
- 7.3 A representation was received on 10 September 2014 from a local resident. The representation relates to the prevention of public nuisance. The resident is concerned that an off licence at this location will bring more people into what is a quiet residential area, and that it will worsen an existing problem with begging and anti-social behaviour. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix B3.
- 7.4 Members should note that some of the representations refer to matters that are outside the scope of the Licensing Act 2003 (ie, the need for a licensed premises). These parts of the representations should not be taken into account during the hearing or the decision making process.

8. Conditions

8.1 The conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule are attached at Appendix C.

9. Statutory Guidance

9.1 Any decision made by the Licensing Authority must be in accordance with the licensing objectives. In addition, the government has issued guidance under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. The parts of the guidance that are particularly relevant in this case are as follows:
