Date Temporary Event Notice applied for: 19/12/2014 to 25/12/2014 daily 0700hrs until 0030hrs.
Please take notice that I am satisfied that allowing the premises to be used in accordance with the notice would undermine the Licensing Objectives of Preventing Crime & Disorder, Public Safety and Prevention of Public Nuisance.
These premises are located within the Cumulative Impact area of Granby Street /London Road which is adjacent to the cumulative impact area of Belvoir Street.
There are 6 Off Licences within the short distance of Granby St CIZ with the latest closing time being midnight. This allows the area to be managed in the night time economy with alcohol only being sold in on licensed premises. This TEN will allow

further 'side-loading' of alcohol with it being consumed on the streets whilst moving from venue to venue. This will increase intoxication as people consume alcohol quickly and are able to purchase larger quantities more cheaply. There is also the added consequence of bottles and cans being discarded on the streets at a time when the area is at its busiest which will impact on the public safety objective.

All off licensed premises in the cumulative impact areas have a condition on their licences which states; the licensee will ensure that no beers, lagers or ciders are sold where the alcohol by volume (ABV) exceeds 5.5%. If these premises were granted a temporary event in its present form it would allow them to sell high strength alcohol throughout the period of the TEN thereby undermining the licensing objectives.

I therefore respectfully request this application is refused.
