1. Purpose of Report

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.


2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the application and representation, Members must consider whether to
 - Grant the licence without modification
 - Grant the licence subject to conditions
 - Exclude from the licence any of the licensable activities
 - Refuse to accept the proposed premises supervisor
 - Reject the application

3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a new premises licence for Sandringham Service Station and summarises the representation received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

5. Application

- 5.1 An application was received on 14 November 2014 from HKS Motors for a new premises licence for Sandringham Service Station. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.

6. Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

6.1 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in

the operating schedule (see section M of Appendix A).

6.2 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

7. Representation

7.1 A representation was received on 4 December 2014 from local residents. The representation relates to the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public nuisance, public safety and the protection of children from harm. The local residents are concerned that should this licence be granted they will experience the same level of anti-social behaviour and noise that they experienced under the previous service station on the same site. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix B.

8. Conditions

8.1 The conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule are attached at Appendix C.
