I would like to object to this licensing application as it stands.

The grounds are all regarding prevention of public nuisance.

I believe the latest time for closing is excessive especially weekdays and Sundays in what is becoming an increasingly residential area.

I am concerned about the removal of all conditions that protected local residents and visitors.

In particular I would like to see a complete prohibition on the use of the Greyfriars Entrance for any other reason than as a Fire Escape as this will reduce any noise escape towards the highest concentrations of residential occupation and in particular this faces onto the Greyfriars Social Services Building where on occasion vulnerable people need to access.

I would like to see measures taken to reduce the possibility of conflict between the patrons of the Market Tavern and patrons of Squares as this historically has been a problem and made that

section of Hotel Street and area to be avoided and was specifically caused by the gathering of patrons in large numbers outside both premises.

I would also like to see tighter and more specific conditions regarding the use of the lobby available on the building to act as a buffer to the escape if noise from the premises and general controls on noise being detrimental to residential community around this establishment.
