24. IMPROVING CORPORATE PARENTING IN LEICESTER CITY

A report of the Deputy Chief Executive was considered which gave details of a proposed Corporate Parenting Initiative and development plan. The report aimed to highlight the needs of Looked After Children, care leavers, and the role of the corporate parent, emphasise the need for political leadership and corporate ownership, establish the strategic direction and operational implementation of corporate parenting and provide better opportunities for looked after children. A Members champion was sought from this committee, and would also be sought from the Social Services Scrutiny Committee and

from Cabinet.

The significant professional input from the Raising the Achievements of Looked After Children (RALAC) Team were recognised as evidenced by the number of Looked After Children achieving 5 A-C and A-G passes at GCSE and a reduction in exclusions of Looked After Children to zero.

Looked After Children were fully engaged with the process via a number of initiatives to ensure full consultation and participation.
