<p>I write in my capacity as Licensing Officer for Leicestershire Police on the authority delegated to me by the Chief Constable.</p> <p>My representation relates to the licensing objectives of Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Prevention of Public Nuisance.</p> <p>This is an application for a Newsagent/convenience store trading from a small premises in a mixed office and residential area.</p> <p>During the day time the nearby area experiences a number of problems relating to street drinkers. New Walk, including Museum Square and the small seating area located just a short distance from the shop at the corner of New Walk and King Street are evidenced as places where street drinkers congregate and complaints are</p>

received from both residents, workers and members of the public passing through the area. The easy accessibility to cheap, high strength alcohol would not promote the licensing objective.

A number of the street drinkers are also homeless and use the deserted office parking areas that are in close proximity to the shop as areas to sleep for the night. A shop in such close proximity selling alcohol early in the morning and late into the evening may attract these people and extend the associated anti-social behaviour further impacting on the promotion of the Licensing objectives.

In its present form the application falls short of fully promoting the licensing objectives and we therefore request that should the licence be granted the following conditions be considered to enhance those already submitted by the applicant in order to promote the licensing objectives and that a reduction in the timings the premises can sell alcohol are considered and amended.

Monday through to Sunday 0900hrs until 2000hrs

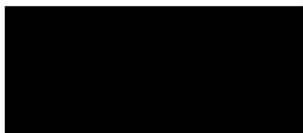
