1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.


2. Determination to be made

 - Reject the application

3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a new premises licence for Quality Wine & Spirit Ltd and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

5. Application

- 5.1 An application was received on 26 May 2017 from PMB Licensing for a new premises licence for Quality Wine & Spirit Ltd. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.

6. Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

- 6.1 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section M of Appendix A).
- 6.2 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

7. Representations

7.1 Representations were received on 22nd and 23rd of June 2017 from the secretary of a local community centre and a local resident. The representations relate to crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance. T

The Secretary of the Community Centre is concerned for the safety of the vulnerable adults using the centre and feels the hours the business would be operating is excessive. The local resident is also concerned that granting this licence will exacerbate the noise and other public nuisance problems already experienced in this area. Copies of the representations are attached at Appendix B1-2.

8.1 The conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule and the representation are attached at Appendix C.
