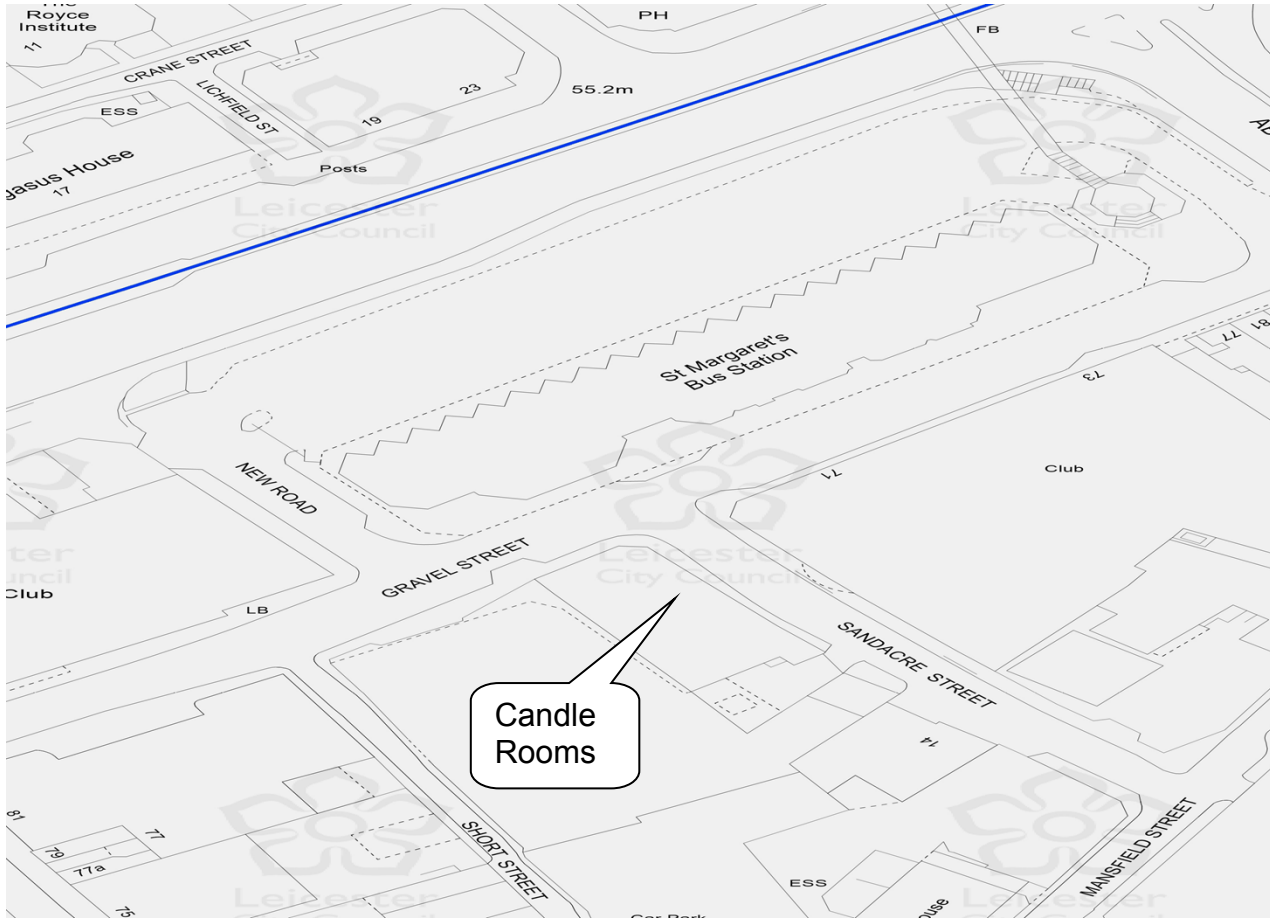
**2. Determination to be made**

- 2.1. Having considered the temporary event notice and the objection notice, Members must consider whether to
- Give the premises user a counter notice under Section 105 (2) of the Licensing Act 2003 if it is considered appropriate for the promotion of a licensing objective to do so; or
  - Disregard the objection notice

**3. Summary**

- 3.1 This report outlines an objection notice given by the Police in response to a temporary event notice given by Mr. Ashlik Madlani for Candle Rooms. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

5.1. A temporary event notice was given on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2017 by Mr. Ashik Madlani for an event at Candle Rooms, 25 Gravel Street, Leicester. The temporary event notice is for an event on 28-29<sup>th</sup> October and is attached at Appendix A.

#### 6. Objection notice

6.1 An objection notice was received on 29<sup>th</sup> September 2017 from Leicestershire Police on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder and public safety. A copy of the objection notice is attached at Appendix B.
