# Application for a new premises licence The Local Store, 116 Bruin Street, LE4 5AY

### **Report of the Director of Neighbourhood and Environmental Services**

#### 1. Purpose of Report

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.

#### 2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the application and representations, Members must consider whether to
  - Grant the licence without modification
  - Grant the licence subject to conditions
  - Refuse to accept the proposed premises supervisor
  - Reject the application

#### 3. Summary

- 3.1 This report outlines an application for a new premises licence for The Local Store, 116 Bruin Street and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.
- 3.2 A new premises licence was previously applied for at this premises. The hearing was held in August 2017, no parties attended the hearing and the licence was refused.

# 5. Application

- 5.1 An application was received on 31 August 2017 from Mr Dharmesh Valobo for a new premises licence for The Local Store. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.
- 5.2 The application is as follows:

### 6. Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

- 6.1 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section 18 of Appendix A).
- 6.2 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

### 7. Representation

7.1 Representations were received between 15 and 26 September 2017 from eight local residents. The representations relate to the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm. The local residents are concerned that granting this licence will exacerbate the noise and anti-social behaviour problems already experienced in this area. Copies of the representations are attached at Appendix B1 – B8.

#### 8. Conditions

8.1 The conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule are attached at Appendix C.
