Objection notice given for three Temporary Event Notices The Shed 5 Yeoman Street Leicester

Report of the Director of Neighbourhood and Environmental Services

1. Purpose of Report

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an objection notice received in relation to three temporary event notices (TENs) given under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome.

2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the temporary event notices and the objection notice, Members must consider whether to
 - Give the premises user a counter notice under Section 105 (2) of the Licensing Act 2003 if it is considered appropriate for the promotion of a licensing objective to do so; or
 - Impose one or more conditions on the temporary event notice(s) if:
 - it is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so, and
 - the condition(s) are also imposed on a premises licence or club premises certificate that has effect in relation to all or part of the same premises as the temporary event notice, and
 - the condition(s) would not be inconsistent with the carrying out of the licensable activities under the temporary event notice(s); or
 - Disregard the objection notice

3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an objection notice given by the Noise Team in response to three temporary event notices given by Miss Elisabeth Barker-Carley for The Shed. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.



5. Temporary event notice

- 5.1. Three temporary event notices were given on 23rd October 2017 by Elizabeth Barker-Carley for events at The Shed, 5 Yeoman Street Leicester. They were not served on the Noise team until two days later on 25th October 2017. The temporary event notices are for events on 14th and 15th November 2017, 21st and 22nd November 2017 and 28th and 29th November 2017, and are all attached at Appendix A.
- 5.2. The temporary event notices are for the following licensable activities:

Licensable activities	Proposed hours on all 3 TENs
The sale by retail of alcohol (for consumption on and off the premises)	22.00 until 04.00
Provision of regulated entertainment Provision of late night refreshment	

6. Objection notice

- 6.1 An objection notice was received on 27th October 2017 from the Noise Team on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance.
- 6.2 A copy of the objection notice, which applies to all three temporary event notices, is attached at Appendix B.

7. Existing premises licence

7.1 The premises identified in the temporary event notices are fully covered by an existing premises licence. One or more of the conditions on this premises licence may be applied to the temporary event notice if Members consider it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and insofar as the conditions are not inconsistent with the carrying on of licensable activities under the notice. A copy of the existing premises licence, including the conditions are attached at Appendix C.

8. Statutory Guidance

8.1 Any decision made by the Licensing Authority must be in accordance with the licensing objectives. In addition, the government has issued guidance under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. The relevant parts of the guidance in this case are as follows:
