### Report of the Director of Education

#### 1. Purpose of the Report

- 1.1 This report recommends the Cabinet to approve funding for a scheme to enable the urgent relocation of the Student Support Service, currently based at Wycliffe Community College. This is necessary if the service is to vacate the Wycliffe site for demolition works to take place for the proposed pool.

**1. Summary**

1.1 The report details proposals for a scheme that requires urgent attention.

**2. Student Support Service  
Background**

2.1 The Student Support Service, Key Stage 4 Exclusions Team, is currently based in the Wycliffe C.C. building. It has to vacate these premises by July 2001, as the building is being demolished.

2.2 They have viewed alternative accommodation throughout the City and found a property on Queens Park Way that would meet their requirements. This property has been declared surplus by Social Services. There are no other alternatives at present, and urgent approval is needed if the proposed Wycliffe demolition is not to be held up.

**Proposal**

2.3 The building requires adaptations for office use and it is estimated that this will cost £70,000. This is to cover building works, electrics, heating and ventilation, structural work, decoration and some carpeting.

2.4 It is proposed to fund this from the Education Department Minor Works Capital Programme for the 2001/02 financial year.
