Report of the Director of Neighbourhood and Environmental Services

1. Purpose of Report

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.

2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the application and representations, Members must consider whether to
 - Grant the licence without modification
 - Grant the licence subject to conditions
 - Exclude from the licence any of the licensable activities
 - Refuse to accept the proposed premises supervisor
 - Reject the application

3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a new premises licence for Pizza Magic, 130 Fosse Road South, Leicester, LE3 0JT and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

5. Application

5.1. An application was received on 6th July 2018 from Mr Attaulah Mamozai and Mr Sefat Mosukhel for a new premises licence for 130 Fosse Road South, Leicester. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.

6. Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

6.1 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section M of Appendix A).

6.2 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

7. Representation

- 7.1 A representation was received on 24th July 2018 from the Noise and Pollution Team. The representation relates to the prevention of public nuisance. The Noise Team are concerned that there is an increased likelihood of noise disturbance and complaints about the activities inside and outside the premises, customer activity and traffic movement. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix B.
- 7.2 A representation was received on 9th August 2018 from Leicestershire Police. The representation relates to all four licensing objectives. The Police are concerned that if the application was successful it is likely that the premises will attract customers of the night time economy and that incidents of noise and disorder will increase in the area. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix B2.

8. Conditions

8.1 The conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule and the representation are attached at Appendix C.
