1. Summary

- 1.1 This report outlines an objection notice given by the Noise Team in response to a temporary event notice given by Joshua Ingram for a private residence at 12 Clarendon Park Road and also highlights the licensing objectives and the relevant parts of both the statutory guidance and the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.



<p>The proposed venue for the even is surrounded on each side by residential properties and is situated in a generally quiet area. The event is of concern as it has high potential to cause loss of amenity and disruption to nearby residential properties by way of noise from amplified music and voices. Additionally, when the event ceases, noise from people exiting the property is also of high concern. The property is surrounded on each side by residential properties and Is situated in a generally quiet area.</p> <p>An event was held previously by the applicant at 100 Howard Road. This event lead to a complaint to the noise and pollution team and further reports of disruption from music and voices from other neighbours at the time.</p> <p>Upon speaking with the applicant, the event will mainly be held in the garden of the property. They are willing to suspend the live music and monitor noise levels at the property. However, this does not address all concerns and the event would still potentially cause significant disruption to nearby residents.</p>

I recommend refusal of the TEN as it does not promote the licensing objective 'Prevention of Public Nuisance'.







Please summarise your concerns about this application:
<p>The proposed venue for the event is surrounded on each side by residential properties. Though the area is relatively noisy in the daytime, it is much less so during night-time hours. The event is of concern as it has high potential to cause loss of amenity and disruption to nearby residential properties by way of noise from amplified music and voices. The use of the garden area especially has the potential to disrupt not just the immediate neighbours, but residents further along.</p> <p>The TEN includes amplified/live music until 23:00, however there is no clear finish time for the event itself. Raised voices can still cause disruption particularly with the proposed attendance of up to 80 people. Additionally, when people exit the premises onto the street, this has the potential to cause further disruption to residents along Welford Road.</p> <p>An event was held previously by the applicant at 100 Howard Road. This event led to a complaint to the noise and pollution team and further reports of disruption from music and voices from other neighbours at the time.</p>

I recommend refusal of the TEN as it does not promote the licensing objective 'Prevention of Public Nuisance'.
