The Chair outlined the procedure for the meeting to be followed and led on introductions.

B1) Application for a summary review of an existing Premises License: Shakespeare's House, 4 Southgates, Leicester, LE1 5SH

11. APPLICATION FOR A SUMMARY REVIEW OF AN EXISTING PREMISES LICENCE: SHAKESPEARE'S HOUSE, 4 SOUTHGATES, LEICESTER, LE1 5SH

The Chair confirmed with the Sub-Committee members that reports for the meeting had been read and that bodycam footage had been viewed.

The Director of Neighbourhood and Environmental Services submitted a report on a summary review of an existing premises license for Shakespeare's House, 4 Southgates, Leicester LE1 5SH.

This was a formal review after interim steps were taken to suspend the premises license for Shakespeare's House and remove the Designated Premises Supervisor on 11 June 2020. The application was made on the grounds that the premises were associated with serious crime or serious disorder or both.

Members noted that representations had been received in respect of the application, which necessitated that the application for a summary review of an existing premises licence had to be considered by members.

Mr Nigel Rixon (Licensing Manager, Leicestershire Police), PC Jeff Pritchard

(Licensing Officer, Leicestershire Police), Su Clement (Environmental Officer), Licensing Team Manager (Policy and Applications), and Legal Advisor to the Sub-Committee were present.

The Licensing Team Manager (Policy and Applications) presented the report and outlined the details of the application. It was noted that a representation was received on 17 June 2020 from the Food Safety Team.

Ms Clement (Food Safety Team) was given the opportunity to outline the reasons for the representation.

Mr Rixon and PC Pritchard for Leicestershire Police were given the opportunity to outline the reasons for the summary review application and responded to questions from the Sub-Committee.

The Licensing Team Manager (Policy and Applications) informed those present that all paperwork had been served on the Premises License Holder and the authority had done all that it could to make him aware of the Hearing.

The Sub-Committee received legal advice from the Legal Advisor to the Sub-Committee in the presence of all those present.

In reaching their decision, Members felt they should deliberate in private on the basis that it was in the public interest, and as such outweighed the public interest of their deliberation taking place with the parties represented present.

The Chair announced that the decision and reasons made during private deliberation would be publicly announced and confirmed in writing within five working days. The Chair informed the meeting the Legal Advisor to the Sub-Committee would be called back to give advice on the wording of the decision.

The Chair then asked all but Members of the Sub-Committee and Democratic Support Officers to disconnect from the meeting. The Sub-Committee then deliberated in private to consider their decision. The Legal Advisor to the Sub-Committee was called back into the meeting to give advice on the wording of the decision.

RESOLVED:

That the premises licence for Shakespeare's House, 4 Southgates, Leicester, LE1 5SH be REVOKED, and the Designated Premises Supervisor be REMOVED from the premises licence.

It was noted that the hearing of the application was held virtually in accordance with the Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus)(Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings)(England and Wales)(Regulations) 2020 (The 2020 Regulations) and in accordance with the Council's own Remote Procedure Rules.

The Sub-Committee Members had been asked to determine an application for a Summary Review of a Premises Licence. In reaching their decision, Members of the Sub-Committee had carefully considered the Committee report presented by the Licensing Team Manager (Policy and Applications) and the representations made by Leicestershire Police, and the Environmental Health Officer from the Food Safety Team, Leicester City Council. No representations had been received from any other party including the Premises Licence Holder (PLH). Sub-Committee Members also listened to the legal advice given to them during the hearing.

The Sub-Committee Members considered the licensing objectives to be of paramount concern and had considered the application on its own merits and in accordance with the licensing authority's Statement of Licensing Policy and guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Leicestershire Police had requested the Summary Review of the Premises Licence as they were satisfied that the premises had been associated with incidents of a serious crime and disorder as a result of which they had no confidence that the PLH would promote or uphold the licensing objectives.

The Sub-Committee considered the information put before them in detail from both Leicestershire Police and the Food Safety Team and considered each of the options available to them.

The Sub-Committee noted that no representations were made or received from the Premises Licence Holder.

As a result of what they had heard, Members were satisfied that that it was appropriate and proportionate in light of the licensing objectives to remove the Designated Premises Supervisor from the premises licence and revoke the premises licence.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Sub-Committee Members accepted the evidence as presented by the Police and the Environmental Health Officer and were satisfied that the premises was associated with serious crime and disorder and failed to comply with Food Safety Regulations and Health and Safety Regulations.

Having carefully evaluated all the information and evidence before them, the Sub-Committee accepted the submissions made by the Police that the PLH was unable to promote or uphold the licensing objectives.

Members believed that the PLH had shown poor management skills and had no confidence in his ability to uphold the licensing objectives, nor did they have confidence in his ability to trade responsibly, legally and comply with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003.

As stated, Members' decision was therefore to remove the DPS from the licence and revoke the premises licence.

Members also reviewed the interim steps imposed on the 11th June 2020 and decided that it was appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives for the steps to remain in place pending any appeal, namely that the DPS be removed from the licence and the premises licence be suspended.

The Sub-Committee's decision was made in the interests of promoting the licensing objectives, particularly the prevention of crime and disorder.

The Premises Licence Holder would be informed that an appeal against the final review or the interim steps must be made within 21 days to the Magistrate's Court.

1. Purpose of Report

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.

2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the application and representations, Members must consider whether to
 - Grant the licence without modification
 - Modify the conditions of the licence
 - Reject the whole application

3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a variation to an existing premises licence for the Dover Castle and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.



5. Existing Licence

5.1. The existing licence is attached at Appendix A.

6. Application

- 6.1 An application was received on 1st July 2020 from Admiral Taverns Piccadilly Limited for a variation to an existing premises licence for the Dover Castle. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix B.
- 6.2 The variation sought by the application is as follows:

• Removal of all existing conditions in Annex 2 of the premises licence and replacing them with new conditions

7. Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

- 7.1 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section M of Appendix B).
- 7.2 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

8. Regulated entertainment

- 8.1 The Live Music Act 2012 and the Legislative Reform (Entertainment Licensing) Order 2014 amended the Licensing Act 2003 in relation to the provision of regulated entertainment. Certain entertainment does not require a licence subject to audience limits, between 08.00 and 23.00 hours each day.
- 8.2 The above exemptions may affect the application under consideration because conditions may not be imposed at this stage to control live or recorded music that is unregulated. However, if problems do occur as a result of that entertainment then conditions may be imposed to control such music in the future after a formal review.

9. Representation

- 9.1 A representation was received on 9th July 2020 from a ward councillor. The representation relates to the prevention of public nuisance. Cllr Kitterick is concerned that the variation would change the nature of the venue to more of a nightclub and that the later terminal hours proposed would cause disruption to nearby residences. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C1.
- 9.2 A representation was received on 24th July 2020 from the Noise Team. The representation relates to the prevention of public nuisance. The Noise Team is concerned that it will be impossible to control the behaviour of customers once dispersed from the immediate

vicinity of the premises and that there is a large amount of residential premises close by. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C2.

10. Conditions

10.1 The conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule are attached at Appendix D.

10. Statutory Guidance

ANNEXES

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

- a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supplied alcohol), or
 -) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a
 particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

- a) a holographic mark, or
- b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person shall ensure that-

- a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

The licence holder will employ door staff at their discretion, or the discretion of the Designated Supervisor.

Any employed door staff will wear a name badge as identification.

No customers apparently carrying open bottles upon entry shall be admitted to the premises at any times the premises are open to the public.

Where CCTV is installed the licence holder will ensure that recordings are retained for a period of 30 days and made available within a reasonable time upon request by the Police.

The licence holder will ensure that no customers shall take glasses or open bottles from the premises.

 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

Please summarise your concerns about this application:

The Dover Castle public house is located away from the busy shopping streets and main thoroughfares within the City Centre. There are a large number of residential properties (flats) which are located close to and within the surrounding area of the premises. The nearest flats are at Dover House, 50 Dover Street, facing Dover Street and Calais Street; approximately 50 metres from the front door area of the premises, and a new development of flats at Dover Street Apartments, 31 Dover Street. See diagram.

Noise levels from late-night entertainment premises located on Belvoir Street / King Street / Wellington Street, Granby Street areas are relatively high late at night, particularly at weekends (under normal circumstances). However, these premises are some way away from the residential properties near the Dover castle and the noise from theses premises is unlikely to affect the residential. This application is a request to extend the hours for opening and licensable activities in the early part of the week to the following

Opening hours (to public) Sunday – from 01.00 hours to 02.30 hours Monday to Thursday from 00.30 hours to 02.30 hours

Licensable Activities (Music, sale of alcohol, late night refreshment etc Sunday – from 00.30 hours to 02.00 hours Monday to Thursday from 00.00 hours to 02.00 hours

During daytime and early evening hours, traffic, theatre traffic and visitors, commercial activity and general street activity would generally be the dominant noise source in the locality of the premises. However, late at night and into the early hours of the morning general on-street noise and traffic noticeably reduces; particularly in the early part of the working week.

The Noise Team have concerns that whilst noise breakout from within the premises may be controlled, noise from customer activity is not as easy to achieve. There is an increased likelihood of noise complaint and disturbance from customers arriving and leaving, smoking outside the property and customers using the rear yard area late at night on the days requested.

Away from the direct influence of the premises there is also the potential for noise disturbance in the early hours to residents within the wider locality from customers moving away from the premises in the Dover Street, Wellington Street, Albion Street, New Walk directions that would be difficult if not impossible for the management of the premises to control.

The Noise Team have confidence in the management of the premises that they are able to minimise / control noise from amplified music and voice systems, mechanical and electrical services etc., from within the building; for which conditions can be attached to the licence.

However, once outside and when moving away from the premises it is likely to be very difficult for the applicant to minimise and or control the activities of pedestrians.

It is considered that the use of conditions upon the licence to control the activities of customers after they have left the control of the premises are likely to be ineffective and unreasonable.

Therefore it is normal practice to recommend that the variation to the licence be **refused** as applied for.
