#### 20. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

There were no apologies for absence.

#### 21. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Members were asked to declare any interests they may have in the business on the agenda.

There were no declarations of interest made.

## 22. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

#### 23. APPLICATION FOR A NEW PREMISES LICENCE: IPL CONVENIENCE STORE, 103 UPPINGHAM ROAD, LEICESTER, LE5 3TB

The Director of Neighbourhood and Environmental Services submitted a report on an application for a new premises licence for IPL Convenience Store, 103 Uppingham Road, Leicester, LE5 3TB.

Members noted that a representation had been received, which necessitated the application had to be considered by the Sub-Committee.

The applicant Mr Haja Harbham Modhwadia was present as was his representative Mr Anil Bhawsar (Licensing Agent). The Licensing Team

Manager (Policy and Applications) and the Legal Adviser to the Sub-Committee were also present. It was noted the person who had made representation against the application was not present.

Introductions were made and the procedure for the meeting was outlined to those present.

The Licensing Team Manager (Policy and Applications) presented the report and outlined details of the application. It was noted that a representation had been received from a local resident on 21<sup>st</sup> July 2020 relating to the licensing objective of the prevention of public nuisance. The local resident was concerned that another off-licence would add to the problem of people drinking in front of the shops in the area and unsociable activities. In addition, the resident indicated that the owner of the premises intended to allow people to drink in the rear of the premises.

The applicant and his licensing agent were then given the opportunity to respond to the points raised and answered questions from the Sub-Committee Members. The applicant 's licensing agent confirmed that the applicant was happy to install CCTV in the storeroom at the premises.

All parties were then given the opportunity to sum up their positions and make any final comments.

The Sub-Committee received legal advice from the Legal Adviser to the Sub-Committee in the presence of all those present and were advised of the options available to them in making a decision. The Sub-Committee were also advised of the relevant policy and statutory guidance that needed to be taken into account when making their decision.

In reaching their decision the Sub-Committee felt they should deliberate in private on the basis that this was in the public interest and as such outweighed the public interest of their deliberation taking place with the parties represented being present, in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

The Chair announced that the decisions and reasons would be publicly announced and confirmed in writing within five working days. The Chair informed the meeting that the Legal Adviser to the Sub-Committee would be called to give advice on the wording of the decision.

The Char then asked that all but the Members of the Sub-Committee and Democratic Support Officers to disconnect from the meeting. The Sub-Committee then deliberated in private to consider their decision.

The Legal Adviser to the Sub-Committee was called back to the meeting to give advice on the wording of the decision.

**RESOLVED:** 

That the application for a new premises licence for IPL

Convenience Store, 103 Uppingham Road, Leicester, LE5 3TB be GRANTED.

It was noted that the hearing of the application was held virtually in accordance with the Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus)(Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings)(England and Wales)(Regulations) 2020 (The 2020 Regulations) and in accordance with the Council's own Remote Procedure Rules.

Members of the Sub-Committee were asked to determine an application made under the Licensing Act 2003. In reaching their decision Members had listened carefully to all the representations, both written and verbal. They took account of the Statutory Guidance, the Regulators' Code and the Council's Licensing Policy.

Members of the Sub-Committee were asked to determine an application for the authorisation of off-sales of alcohol at IPL Convenience Store, seven days a week, from 7.00 am to 10.00 pm daily. Members had considered the representation received from one local resident who had raised concerns regarding the prevention of public nuisance caused by people drinking outside shops and discarding cans. The representor had also indicated that the owner of the premises intended to allow people to drink alcohol in the rear of the premises. As an unauthorised on-sales of alcohol, this part of the representation related to the prevention of crime.

#### REASON FOR THE DECISION

The Sub-Committee was required in reaching a decision to assess the evidence, but the representor had not provided any evidence or other information in support of the representations. The Sub-Committee noted that no representations against the grant of the licence had been received from other residents or from any responsible authorities. On the contrary, the applicant had submitted a petition in support of the application signed by sixty-nine residents.

In those circumstances, the Sub-Committee's decision was that it was appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives of the prevention of public nuisance and the prevention of crime to grant the application subject to the conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule as set out at Appendix C of the Committee Report, with two additional conditions specified by Members of the Sub-Committee as follows:

- The applicant to install CCTV coverage in the storeroom at the premises.
- The prohibiting of dustbins and recycling bins being emptied or collected between the hours of 9.00 pm and 7.00 am.

There being no other items of urgent business, the meeting closed at 10.42am.

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.


#### 2. Determination to be made

#### 3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a new premises licence for 276 Victoria Road East, Leicester and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

#### 5. Application

- 5.1 An application was received on 4<sup>th</sup> August 2020 from Mrs Harpreet Arora for a new premises licence for 276 Victoria Road East, Leicester. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.
- 5.2 The application is as follows:

#### 6. Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

- 6.1 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section 18 of Appendix A).
- 6.2 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

#### 7. Representation

7.1 Representations have been received from local residents, business owners and a ward councillor. The representations relate to the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public nuisance, public safety and the protection of children from harm. The representees are concerned that another premises in the area selling alcohol will increase crime, disorder, anti-social behaviour, noise and littering. Copies of the representations including two petitions with around 600 signatures are attached at Appendix B1 to B11. At B12 is an email from the Team Manager at The Willows clarifying her position that she was not objecting to the application.

#### 8. Conditions

8.1 The conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule and the representation are attached at Appendix C.

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

# Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. 



Victoria Road East is currently served by two convenience stores, one which is licensed open from 8am to 10pm, Monday to Saturday and Sunday until 8pm. Additionally, at the other end of the Victoria Road East there is a licensed convenience store which is open until 10 p.m.

There is a high density of residential property in and around the Victoria Road East, whose residents have been affected by antisocial behaviour caused by late night drinking. These include residents in flats over shop premises on the Street.

The proposed application for a new premises licence at Victoria Road East will increase the residential population potentially adversely affected by another alcohol retail store. The increase in noise, litter, traffic and antisocial behaviour will have a serious negative impact on the quality of life of residents living on and around the Victoria Road East.

On the notice of application for 276 Victoria Road East, the opening times will be 8am to 11.00pm, alcohol are a major contributory factor to levels of crime and disorder. In particular density and capacity can have a significant impact on the levels of crime and disorder.


Once the 'tipping point' has been reached where there are too many alcohol shops in an area, leading to increased and unacceptable levels of crime and anti-social behaviour, it is very difficult to rescind licences and reduce the negative impact on the community of the increased sale of alcohol.

The absence of public toilets can lead to users of the late night economy outlets urinating and defecating in the street or in alley ways. Increasing the availability of alcohol in Victoria Road East could exacerbate this problem.

Increasing the number of hours convenience stores with a licence to sell alcohol will exacerbate the litter problems which Victoria Road East has already in view of the numerous fast food outlets already operating throughout the Street.

All staff should be trained to apply the sale of alcohol restrictions on under-age drinkers but there is a possibility that increasing the availability of alcohol open until 11pm on Victoria Road East could increase the risk of under-age drinking in the area with the attendant anti-social behaviour issues for the community and risks to the health and well being of minors by under-age drinking.

For the above reasons Victoria Road East Residents is registering its objection to the licence application for Harpreet Arora – 276 Victoria Road East, Leicester, LE5 0LF.

As a local resident and ex professional boxer I have concern for the above licence applications, in terms disturbance from noise, public nuisance, crime and disorder on the local residential amenity and safety.

The police have better ways of spending their time than being called out by residents of our street because of noise and disturbances, and so I ask you to oppose the applications.

I hope that the council will not grant this inappropriate licence to Harpreet Arora at 276 Victoria Road East, LES OLF. In response to the four licensing objections directly:

**Prevent of crime and disorder** - I believe the granting of applications will bring crime and disorder to the area which would lead to criminal damage and other criminal acts, and disorder due to excess consumption of alcohol such as fighting in the street. If littering is viewed as a crime, then it applies here, as brining more people to the area for the activities being applied for will lead to littering in the area.

**Public nuisance** - the increased amount of traffic, be it cars, taxis or persons on foot will be a nuisance to the public and residents in the area. Noise from people who consumes alcohol would be a nuisance to the public and residents in the area that currently experience a peaceful environment. Parking will be affected in an area already experiencing problems with available parking and inevitably parking in unsuitable areas will become worse, causing nuisance to other road users and local residents. If littering is viewed as a public nuisance, then it applies here, as brining more people to the area for the activities being applied for will lead to littering in the area.

**Public safety** - an increase in traffic in the area would certainly be a concern for safety. Those visiting the shops in the area will feel concerned for their safety given there being people in the area that may have consumed excess levels of alcohol. The risk of public violence is increased in the area with the sale of alcohol and people suffering abuse other than violence, be it verbal or otherwise, would be increased by the granting of these license at 276 Victoria Road East, LE5 0LF.

**Protection of children from harm** - Noise from increased traffic would inevitably disturb children's sleep and the experience would be disturbing to them as what is currently a peaceful area would become noisy at times when children are sleeping. Shouting or the noise outside the premises would be extremely disturbing for children in the nearby area.

I am emailing to oppose the application for a new premises license at 276 Victoria Road East, Leicester by Harpreet Arora.

There are already 4 licensed premises in the immediate area and having another would only add to the problems that we have in the area with street drinkers, congregating on the Cravens Recreational Ground which is at the rear of 276 Victoria Road East.

Drinkers congregate on the Cravens from 10am in the morning and some are there at 2am in the morning causing not only a noise nuisance to local residents whose properties back onto the Cravens but they leave the ground littered with beer cans and empty bottles which are often smashed on the pathway, despite there being ample litter bins. Three of the current licenced premises supplying alcohol close at either 8pm or 9pm and to have yet another supplying alcohol until 11pm is not acceptable.

I personally have had to report the state of the litter on numerous occasions through Love Leicester (they must be sick of me sending in reports) and had to report to the Police about ASB on the park. Local residents are very angry and do not want another licensed premises in the area.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN

I've seen an advert in the Leicester Mercury for a New Premises License at 276 Victoria Road East, LE5 0LF - applicant Harpreet Arora.

I am shocked that there could be a new off license shop opening at 276 Victoria Road East, LE5 OLF. I feel this could be harmful to the community. There are already two

Off Licenses on Victoria Road East, the Best One on 278 Victoria Road East who have been running their store for around 15 years, which has been my regular shop for nearly

as long as that store has been open; and another store that I will admit that I have not used as much. There is a post office next to the park, and there is another Off Licence near

the corner to Gipsy Lane.

To allow the application to go ahead would be very damaging to Best One and the local community. The Best One would need to do cutbacks on their staff and the new store

will try to undercut Best One. For the local community a new store would cause problems on Victoria Road East, due to youths congregating and the store would be opening until

11pm and a lot of people in the community are not very happy, as most of the community has a good rapport with the staff at the Best One, their staff can often tell the youths to move

without any repercussions such as being egged, or even having stones and bricks thrown at their windows. I know that Best One had these issues when they first started their business

on their premises, but due to being on such good terms with the local community, I don't think that they have these issues that often now. Furthermore, the new store is trying to apply for

a licence till 11pm, which is definitely the worst possible scenario; there is already an issue of drunken people in this neighbourhood, having YET another store will worsen this by many times.

People being able to buy alcohol into the later parts of night is an incredibly, stupid idea. Imagine the homeless or the youths being able to get alcohol from a store at 11pm, I know

the difference may only be 2 hours, but those 2 hours are the difference between the neighbourhood being awake and being asleep, being able to have a good night's rest compared

to a drunken fool causing havoc at the middle of the night. And while I am talking about alcohol, just having another store will affect the consumption of alcohol too.

I realise that economically speaking competition helps the consumer at spending less, but with Northfields I think that there is enough competition for normal necessities like food or water,

the effect will most likely be on the prices of alcohol. Each store will try to find a way to undercut the other in every product, but it is the last thing we need is to make alcohol more cheaper in

an already struggling community.

Do not misunderstand me and think that I don't mind paying extra for all my necessities, I do mind, like any person would, however I just know that having extra competition, that stays open for longer,

will cause undercutting prices of alcohol, congregation of youths that do not appreciate being told what to, or not do, increased crime incidents in this already troubled area, the Craven Recreation

Ground would have more litter cans and empty bottles all over the floor, most likely alcohol, and adding more bins wouldn't solve this. I also think that there could be an increase in drink and drive

incidents due to the late time that the new store is applying for, many more drivers will be braver to drink and drive the alcohol they purchase at 11pm, where there feel confident as there are less

cars that they could crash into, and less police presence too.

As a local resident I feel we need to think carefully about this and we should realise now before we have made a mistake, that this time, the pros do not outweigh the cons.

Increase in noise complaints,

Increase in littering,

Increase in crime

increase in under age drinking

increase in parking issues

increase in drink and driving

I feel Public Safety is very important and this application must be declined.


