#### 1. Purpose of Report

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.

#### 2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the application and representation, Members must consider whether to

#### 3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a new premises licence for New Parks Food, 63 Keightley Road, Leicester LE3 9LQ and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

#### 5. Application

- 5.1 An application was received on 21<sup>st</sup> January 2021 from New Parks Food Ltd for a new premises licence for New Parks Food, 63 Keightley Road, Leicester, LE3 9LQ. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.
- 5.2 The application is as follows:

#### 6. Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

- 6.1 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section M of Appendix A).
- 6.2 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

#### 7. Representation

7.1 A representation was received on 17<sup>th</sup> February 2021 from a local business. The representation relates to the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance, and the protection of children from harm. The local resident is concerned that allowing the premises to open until late at night will result in underage drinking and anti-social behaviour. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix B.

#### 8. Conditions

8.1 The conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule and the representation are attached at Appendix C.



All members of staff will be formally trained in their roles and responsibilities b) The prevention of crime and disorder An 8 camera multiplex CCTV system will be in operation with visible monitor and due warning signs displayed to the public of it's use within the premises. One interior camera is positioned to focus on the entrance and exit doorways to help with the prevention and detection of crime and help with the protection of customers' and staff safety. Recording data will be timed, dated and have a minimum 31 days records. The Police and Local Authority Officers may have access to the system at any reasonable time and downloadable recordings on request. A refusal register is to be kept to record any incidents. c) Public safety Fire safety equipment includes alarms, 2 fire extinguishers which are regularly maintained. All electrical equipment is safety checked (pat tested). Fire exit signs are displayed and the staff instructed in emergency evacuation procedures. d) The prevention of public nuisance A waste bin is provided. The front pavement is swept daily or more frequently if littered. Notices displayed requesting customers to leave the premises as quietly as possible. e) The protection of children from harm

A maximum of 3 unaccompanied children are allowed in the shop at any one time. Challenge 25 and "Pass" approved Notices displayed requesting valid proof of age for any age restricted products. "No I.D - No Sale". All staff are trained to serve alcohol and age sensitive products under the guidance of the DPS.



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I believe that it is quite unreasonable wish to limit the permitted hours for this application . With

more shift work and flexi-time, shopping habits have changed dramatically during the last 17 years and if they choose not to recognise this situation, that is their own personal choice.

The Operating Schedule in the application gives clear information as to how the treatment of possible underage sales are controlled.

New stronger initiatives have been introduced with regards to Proxy Selling to youngsters and I attach the Warning Notices and Staff Training Plans to be adopted by these premises.

The next door unit is a Chinese takeaway who trade until 2300 hours and it is noticed that people waiting for their order will come into the shop for extras to enjoy with their meal.

As there hasn't been any incidents of anti-social behaviour to record, no comment would be relevant at this time, However, a zero policy for ASb will be promoted.

#### **STAFF TRAINING QUESTIONS**

#### Proxy sales of alcohol

'Proxy sales' is a term used to describe the purchase of alcohol on behalf of children.

A person commits an offence if they buy or attempt to buy alcohol on behalf someone under 18. It is also an offence for a person to buy or attempt to buy alcohol for someone under 18 to drink on licensed premises. However, it is legal for someone aged 18 or over to buy beer, wine or cider for someone aged 16 or 17 to drink with a table meal on licensed premises, as long as the young person is accompanied at the meal by a person aged 18 or over.

Although it is the person who buys or attempts to buy alcohol for a child who commits the offence, you have a duty under "the protection of children from harm" licensing objective to prevent such sales from occurring.
