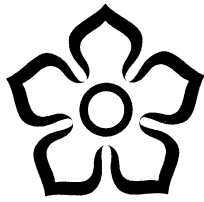

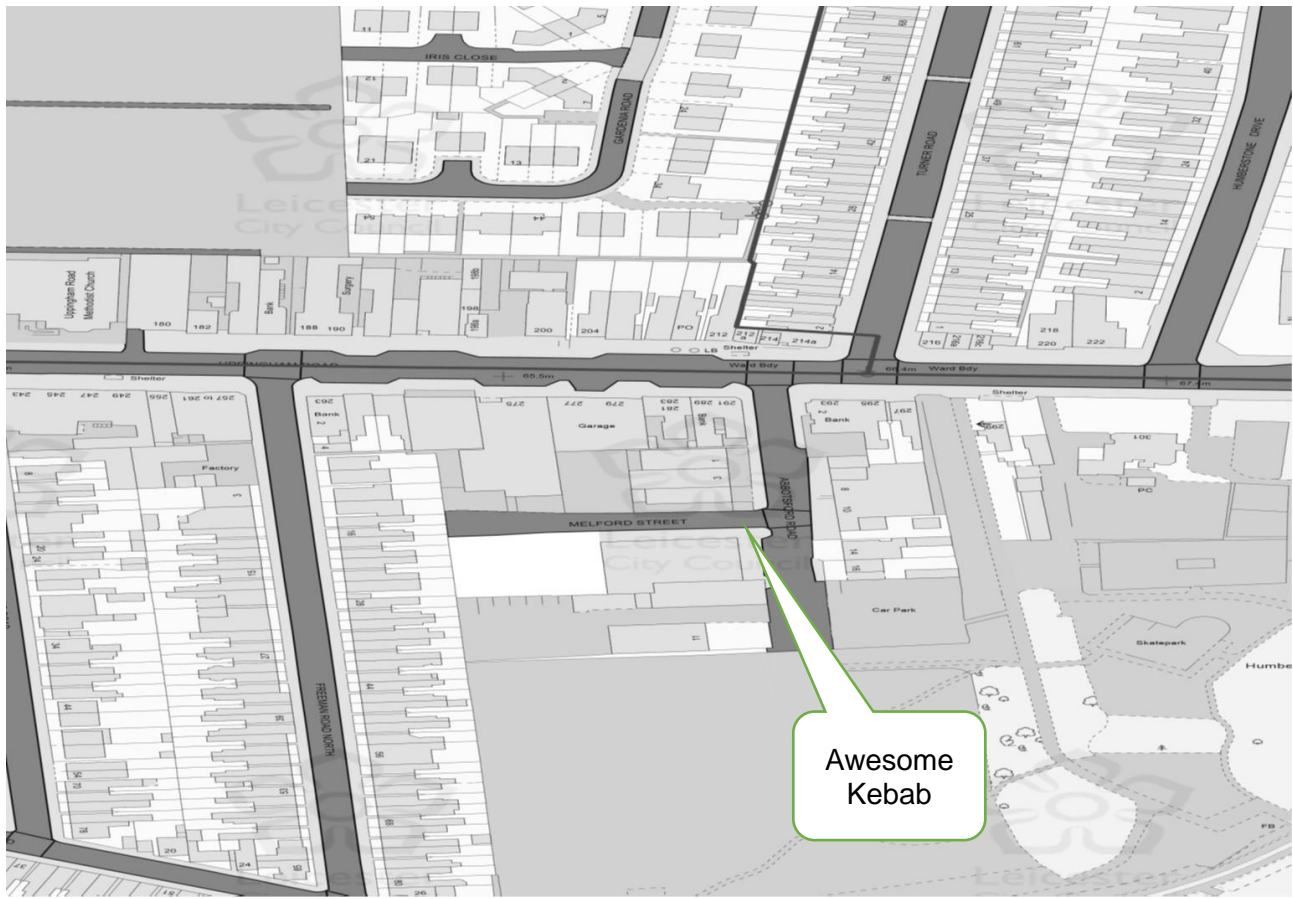

Report of the Director of Neighbourhood and Environmental Services

1. Location



2. Purpose of the Report

To determine an application for the grant of a street trading consent under Schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982, for Awesome Kebab. The applicant is Mr Saif Uddin.

3. Options for the Sub-Committee

The Sub-Committee may determine the application in one of the following ways:-

- (a) Grant the application, or
- (b) Refuse the application.

A licensing authority may attach such conditions as they consider reasonably necessary when granting or renewing a street trading consent. This may include conditions to prevent obstruction of the street or danger to persons using it, or nuisance or annoyance (whether to persons using the street or otherwise). The authority may at any time vary the conditions of a street trading consent.

The authority may include in a street trading consent permission for its holder to trade in a consent street

- a) from a stationary van, cart, barrow or other vehicle; or
- b) from a portable stall.

If the authority includes such a permission, it may make the consent subject to conditions

- a) as to where the holder of the street trading consent may trade by virtue of the permission, and
- b) as to the times between which or periods for which he may so trade.

A street trading consent may be granted for any period not exceeding 12 months but may be revoked at any time.

There is no right of appeal against a determination of the Licensing Authority in this instance, but as a matter of good practice Members should give reasons for their decision at the time it is announced.

4. Recommendation

It is recommended that the application be refused in accordance with the City Council's street trading policy.

5. Report

Mr Uddin has applied for the grant of a street trading consent for Awesome Kebab, container at the side of the Memon Centre, Abbotsford Road, Leicester, under schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.

Mr Uddin would like to sell donner kebabs, HMC chicken and Angus beef burgers, Thursday to Sunday 4.00pm to 11.00pm.

Street trading policy

The policy says that there will be a general presumption in favour of granting consents for street trading by ice cream vans and by mobile operators who remain stationary at a particular location only long enough to serve customers at that location, provided that they conform to any code of practice issued by the City Council.

The policy provides for certain exceptions, including:

- a) The immediate vicinity of Leicester City Football Club and Leicester Tigers, for the purpose of the sale of favours and materials associated with the football clubs that are organised and controlled by those clubs.

- b) Operators selling food who wish to trade on industrial estates, where no other adequate provision is provided.
- c) Limited period consents in respect of particular types of operations in conjunction with specific events in the City.

None of these exceptions are relevant to this application.

Other applications for consents will be considered and each case will be decided on its own merits. The following matters will be taken into account:

- Public nuisance
- Crime and disorder
- Road safety
- Health and safety at schools and for their pupils
- Likely demand for goods being sold
- Availability of goods being sold in other fixed premises in the vicinity
- Objections received from nearby residents, businesses and statutory agencies

Representations

Details of the application have been passed to the Police, Highways, Noise Control, and the Food Team. A notice has been placed at the location concerned for two weeks inviting anyone affected by the proposal to submit representations to the Licensing section.

No representations have been received from the Police, Highways, Noise Control and the Food Team in relation to this application. However, a representation has been received from a member of the public.

The representee is concerned that if this application is granted, it will cause more traffic and parking issues on an already very congested road causing danger to the public. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix B1.

A statement has also been received from the Licensing Enforcement Team providing background information about this application and photos of the site and public notices which is attached at Appendix B2.

6. Legal Implications (Including Human Rights Act)

A licensing decision is a determination of civil rights to which Article 6 Right to a fair trial principles apply. Article 1 of the First Protocol gives the right of peaceful enjoyment of possessions, which would include a street trading consent.

Schedule 4 paragraph 7 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 details the procedure to be followed for the grant and renewal of street trading consents. The council and the holder of a street trading consent must comply with the requirements of this paragraph.

Schedule 4 paragraph 8 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 enables the holder of a street trading consent to employ any other person to assist in their trading without a further consent being required.

Where a consent is surrendered or revoked, the council shall remit or refund as they consider appropriate the whole or a part of any fee paid for grant or renewal of the

consent as per Schedule 4 paragraph 9(5) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982.

A person who engages in street trading without a street trading consent, or who makes a false statement in connection with an application for a consent may be subject to prosecution, and upon conviction may be liable for a fine of up to £1,000, pursuant to Schedule 4 paragraph 10 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982

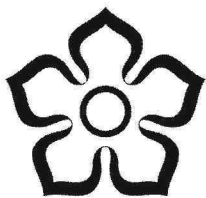

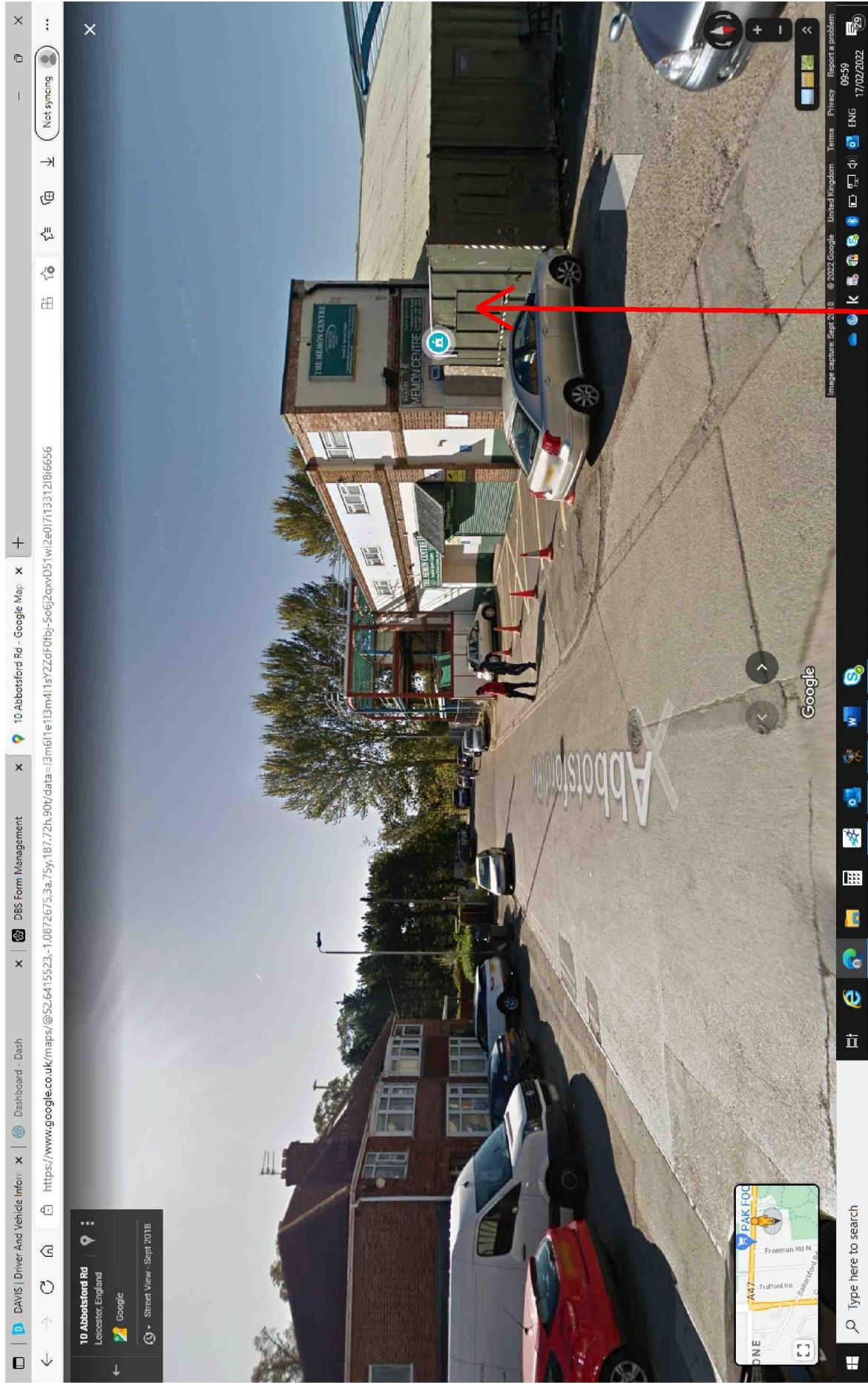

The food trailer in question was about to open without planning consent. I have previously informed your department of this and my concerns as follows

- . The road is at maximum capacity
 - . Cars continually park on double yellow lines obstructing the flow of traffic
 - . large Iceland and pak foods lorries get stuck on the road.
 - . Madrasa school and Memon centre are a big strain on traffic congestion.
- Safety of the public and businesses put at risk as
During peak times emergency services cannot get to their destination

I have spoken to the businesses on the road notably Tuning services 5 Abbotsford rd, directly next to the trailer, also Parker hire and Westminster Home Care. These are all next to each other and none have been informed by letter or email of this application. I myself of [REDACTED] have not been informed. This statement (consisting of 2 pages each signed by me) is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.

Dated the 17 day of March 2022

I am employed by Leicester City Council's Licensing Team as a Licensing Enforcement Officer. Part of my duties include the enforcement of and ensuring compliance with the legislation relating to unlawful street trading, under the powers provided by the Leicester City Council Act 2006 and the Local government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982. This statement details background information on my involvement with a proposed business to be known as Awesome Kebabs trading from a converted shipping container on Abbotsford Road, Leicester.

On 21st October 2021 I was allocated an enquiry regarding a possible unlicensed street trading business operating from 7 Abbotsford Road. The email consisted of several photographs showing the location of the container and detailed the owner of the container as working from Bombay Street Food, 8 Abbotsford Road. A few of the photographs, from the email are attached and marked as Appendix 1-3.

Contact was made with the owner and on 27th October 2021, I met with Mr Saif Uddin on site to discuss his plans for the container.

Mr Uddin advised the container had been on site for at least 11 years and belonged to the Memon Centre. He is renting the container from the Memon Centre and the intention is to prepare and serve food to users of the Memon Centre once it re-opens and on Thursday to Sunday evenings, to operate as a takeaway from the serving hatch to members of the public till 10 or 11pm.

I advised Mr Uddin of the requirement of a street trading consent and the application process and I sent an email containing the link to the street trading information on the Leicester City Council Website.

On 26th November 2021 I received a text message from Mr Uddin stating he had submitted his application and payment but had not heard anything further. I checked our records and

On 7th December 2021, I received another text message from Mr Uddin asking for the email to be sent again so he can complete the form. I resent the original email to Mr Uddin on 9th December 2021.

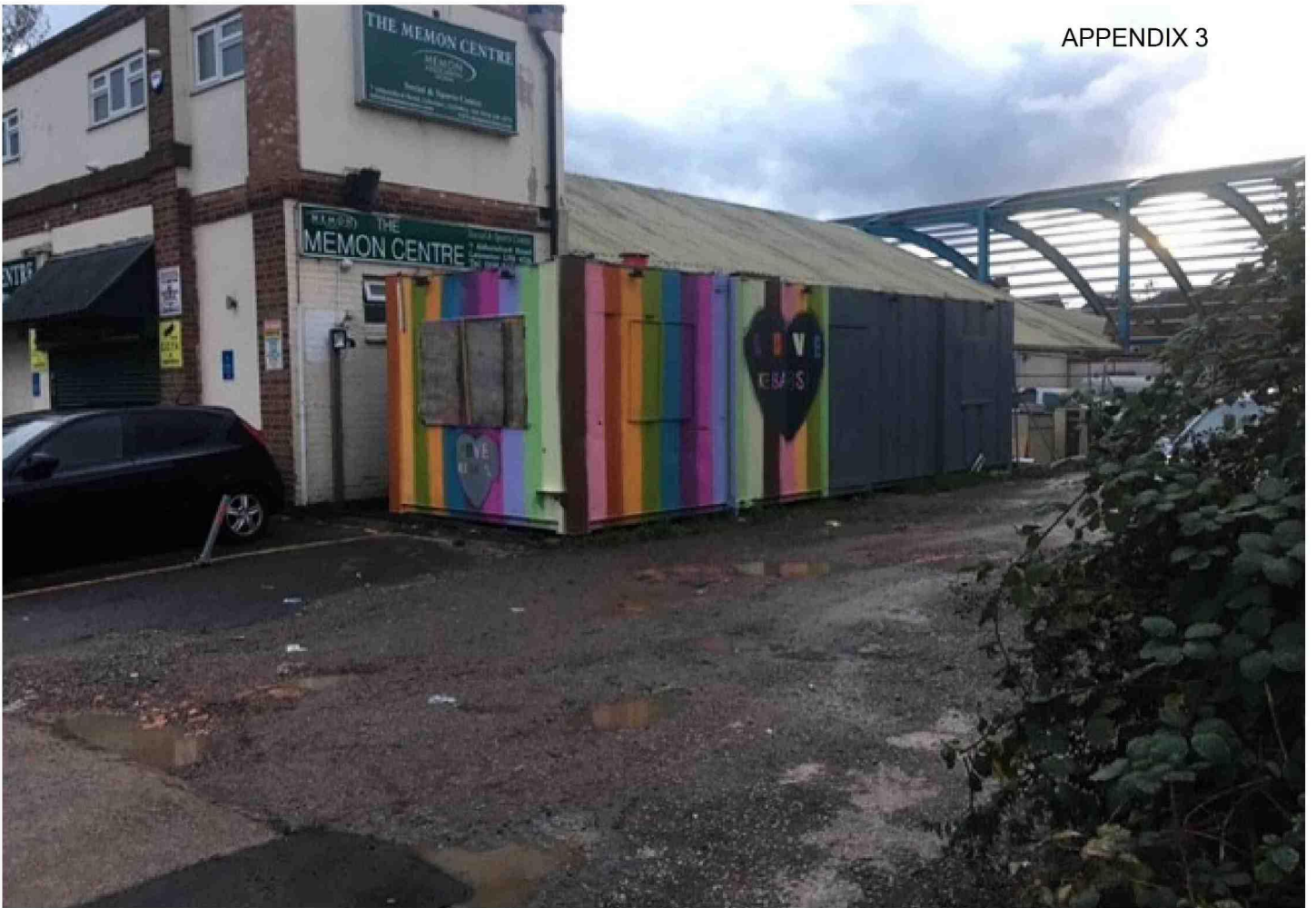

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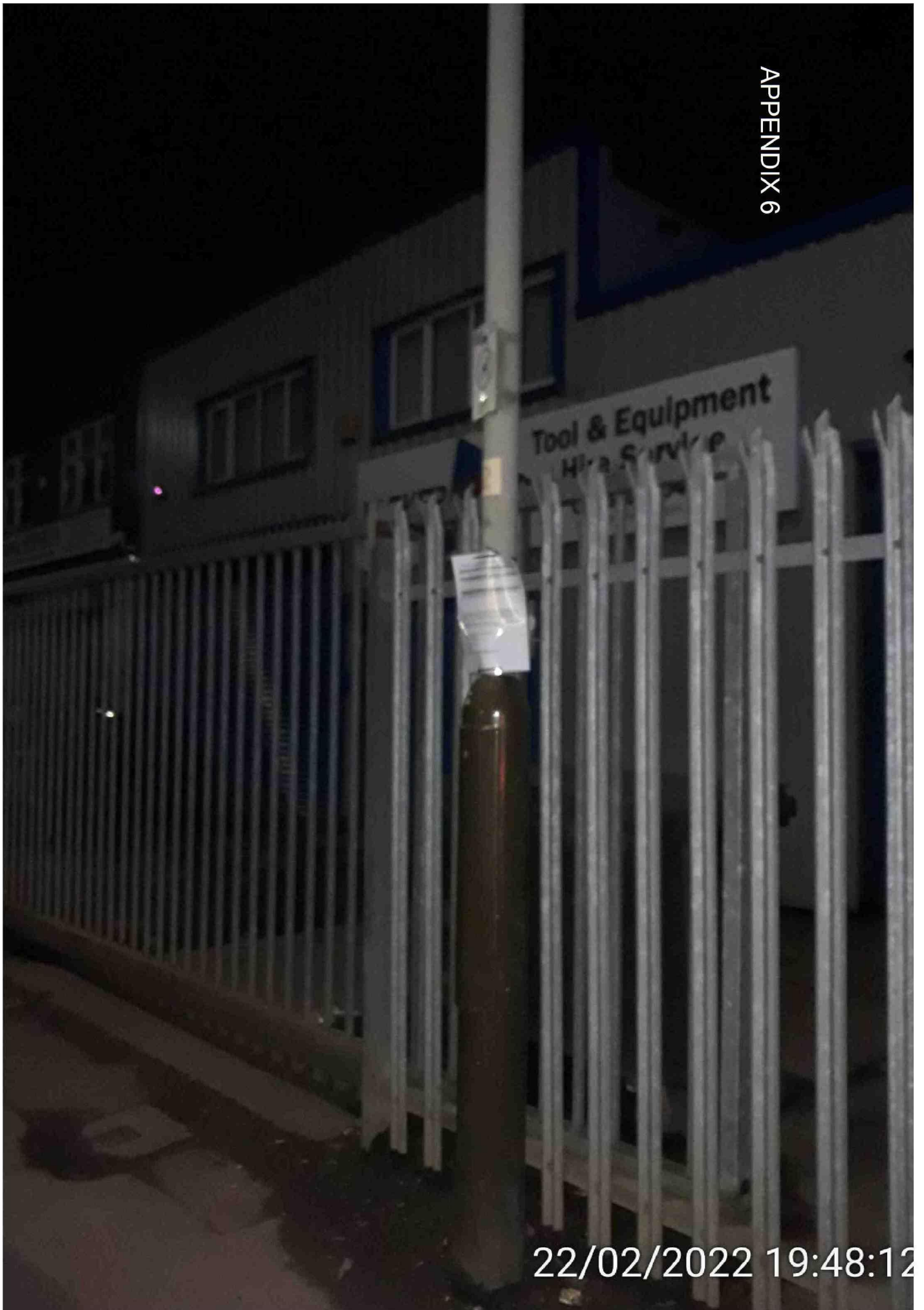
