1. APPOINTMENT OF CHAIR

The meeting commenced at 10.30am when all parties required were present.

Councillor Pickering was appointed as Chair for the meeting.

2. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

There were no apologies for absence.

3. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Members were asked to declare any interests they may have in the business to be discussed.

There were no declarations of interests.

4. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

RESOLVED:

That the minutes of the meetings held on 8 February, 30 March and 20 April 2022 be confirmed as a correct record.

5. APPLICATION FOR A NEW PREMISES LICENCE: VICKY'S CHIPPY, 27 AVENUE ROAD EXTENSION, LEICESTER, LE2 3EP

The Director of Neighbourhood and Environmental Services submitted a report on an application for Vicky's Chippy, 27 Avenue Road Extension, Leicester, LE2 3EP.

Mr Baig was present on behalf of the applicant MSF Venture Ltd alongside business partner, Mr Khan. Councillor Kitterick joined the meeting late, and Mr Brown (Clarendon Park and Friends) was present, giving representation. Also present was the Chief Licensing Officer, Licensing Enforcement Team Manager, having also joined the meeting late, and the Legal Adviser to the Sub-Committee.

The Chief Licensing Officer presented the report and answered questions from Members. It was noted that a representation was received on 30 June 2022 from the Licensing Enforcement in relation to the prevention of public nuisance in response to the application by MSF Venture Ltd received on 27 June 2022 on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance. Further representations were received on 07 July 2022 from a local ward councillor on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance.

A further five representations were made by members of the public, on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance.

It was noted that another representation had been made on 12 July 2022 from another member of the public, whose representation had not been included in the report. The representation had been made on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance.

Mr Brown was given the opportunity to outline the details of his representation as well as on behalf of the members of the public and answered questions from the applicant.

Councillor Kitterick was given the opportunity to outline the details of his representation and answered questions from Members and the applicant. He then left the meeting.

The Licensing Enforcement Team Manager was given the opportunity to outline the details of his representation and answered questions from Members and the applicant. The applicant has reached agreement with an additional condition with the Licensing Enforcement Team.

The Applicant was given the opportunity to present its case and answered questions from Members, the Legal Adviser to the Sub-Committee and those giving representation.

All parties were given the opportunity to sum up their positions and make any final comments.

The Sub-Committee received legal advice from the Legal Adviser to the Sub-Committee in the presence of all those present and were advised of the options available to them in making their decision.

The Sub-Committee were also advised of the relevant policy and statutory guidance that needed to be taken into account when making their decision,

In reaching their decision, the Sub-Committee felt they should deliberate in private on the basis that this was in the public interest and as such outweighed the public interest of their deliberation taking place with the parties represented present, in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

The Chair announced that full reasons for the decision would be provided in writing within five working days. The Chair informed the meeting that the Legal Adviser to the Sub-Committee would be called back to give advice on the wording of the decision.

The Chair then asked all but Members of the Sub-Committee and Democratic Support Officers to withdraw from the meeting. Members then deliberated in private to consider their decision.

In reaching their decision the Sub-Committee Members had carefully considered the written report presented by the Chief Licensing Officer and considered all the representations, both written and oral, and had taken account of the Statutory Guidance, the Regulators' Code and the Council's Licensing Policy.

The Sub-Committee recalled the Legal Adviser to the Sub-Committee to give advice on the wording of the decision.

RESOLVED:

That it was appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objective of the prevention of public nuisance to grant a License authorising the provision of late-night refreshment to the public for consumption off the premises, on Sunday to Thursday from 23:00 to 00:00 hours and on Friday and Saturday from 23:00 to 01:00 hours, subject to the following conditions:

- Customers shall not be admitted to the premises after 23:00 hours daily.
- Customers who attend the premises after 23:00 hours shall not be provided with late night refreshment for consumption off the premises.
- Late Night refreshment shall only be provided by way of home delivery made by drivers employed at the premises by the licence holder using non-motorised vehicles (i.e. pedal cycles), electric vehicles or hybrid vehicles.

[For the avoidance of doubt, the engagement of a delivery driver with or through another operator to collect food from the premises for onward delivery to a customer would breach this condition.]

• The conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule detailed in Appendix C of the Licensing Officer's report.

 The conditions consistent with representation / agreement from the Licensing Enforcement team detailed in Appendix C of the Licensing Officer's report.

The applicant would be provided with the reasons for the decision in writing within five working days.

All parties would be advised of the right to appeal the decision to the Magistrates Court.

1. Summary

1.1 This report outlines an application under the Licensing Act 2003 for a variation to an existing premises licence for Bricklayers Arms, 78 Welford Road, Leicester, LE2 7AB and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives and the relevant parts of both the statutory guidance and the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

2. Determination to be made

- 2.1 Having considered the application and representations, Members must consider whether to
 - Grant the licence without modification
 - Modify the conditions of the licence
 - Reject the whole application

3. Application and promotion of the licensing objectives

- 3.1 An application was received on 26 July 2022 from Star Pubs & Bars Limited for a variation of an existing premises licence for Bricklayers Arms, 78 Welford Road Leicester, LE2 7AB. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A1.
- 3.2 The variation application is as follows:

- 3.3 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section M of Appendix A).
- 3.4 The existing licence is attached at Appendix B.
- 3.5 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

3.6 Location Plan



4. Representation(s)

- 4.1 A representation was received on 18 August 2022 from the Police The representation relates to the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance. The representee is concerned that the applicant wishes to extend its licensable activities between Wednesday and Saturday and operate until 3am. They feel that the applicant has failed to address how it will manage the outside area to prevent a public nuisance and reduce the likelihood of crime and disorder. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C1.
- 4.2 A representation was received on 19 August 2022 from the Noise team. The representation relates to the prevention of public nuisance. The representee is concerned that if the variation is granted without further measures to control noise from the premises noise nuisance will occur. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C2.
- 4.3 A representation was received on the 22nd of August 2022 from the Licensing Enforcement Team The representation relates to Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance, and Protection of Children from Harm. The representee is concerned that the additional hour extension of licensable activities allows for a later drinking facility and the ability for persons to arrive later at the premises after having consumed alcohol at other locations. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C3.

5. Conditions

- 5.1 There are no new conditions that are consistent with the application.
- 5.2 The Live Music Act 2012 and the Legislative Reform (Entertainment Licensing) Order 2014 amended the Licensing Act 2003 in relation to the provision of regulated entertainment. Certain entertainment does not require a licence subject to audience limits, between 08.00 and 23.00 hours each day. These exemptions may affect the application under consideration because conditions may not be imposed at this stage to control live or recorded music that is unregulated. However, if problems do occur as a result of that entertainment then conditions may be imposed to control such music in the future after a formal review.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

- a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supplied alcohol), or
 - ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

- a) a holographic mark, or
- b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person shall ensure that-

- a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority

All external doors and windows must be kept closed, except for access and egress, in all rooms when events involving amplified music or speech are taking place.

A noise limiting device shall be installed, fitted and maintained in such a manner as to control all sources of amplified music at the premises. The limiter shall be set at a level in agreement with the Licensing Authority. Once set such a device should be inaccessible to the licence holder or her staff.

Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly.



- a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supplied alcohol), or
 - ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a
 particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

- a) a holographic mark, or
-) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person shall ensure that-

- a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

A noise limiting device shall be installed, fitted and maintained in such a manner as to control all sources of amplified music at the premises. The limiter shall be set at a level in agreement with the Licensing Authority. Once set such a device should be inaccessible to the licence holder or her staff.


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
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

I write in my capacity as Leicester City Centre's alcohol licensing officer for Leicestershire Police, with delegated authority given by the Chief Constable.

My representation to this major premises licence variation application is based upon the licensing objectives as per the Licensing Act 2003.

The application in its current format if granted would undermine two of the four licensing objectives, in relation to:

- (1) The prevention of crime and disorder.
- (2) The prevention of public nuisance.

The licence was last amended in June 2012 to represent the existing licensable

activities and operating hours.

The premises existing licensable activities and opening hours to the public are:

- (1) Performance of Live Music (Indoors only) Monday to Sunday from 10am until 2am.
- (2) Playing of Recorded Music (Indoors only)
 Monday to Sunday from 10am until 2am.
- (3) <u>Late Night Refreshments (Indoors only)</u>
 Monday to Sunday from 11pm until 2am.
- (4) <u>Supply of Alcohol (On & Off the premises)</u> Monday to Sunday from 10am until 2am.
- (5) <u>Hours the premises are open to the public:</u> Unrestricted. Midnight to midnight.

The application proposes to amend these to:

- (1) Performance of Live Music (Indoors only)
 Monday to Tuesday from 10am until 2am = No change
 Wednesday to Saturday from 10am until 3am = +1 hour
 Sunday from 10am until 2am = No Change
- (2) Playing of Recorded Music (Indoors only)

The applicant also wishes to remove the existing Annex 2 conditions.

The premises have been closed to the public since the start of the coronavirus pandemic in March 2020.

The premises are located on the junction of Welford Road and Regent Road.

The premises are located within a two-storey building and located upon the ground floor. There are a number of first and second floor empty rooms, which I assume belong to the premises.

The premises are located less than a four-minute walk from Leicester Rugby Club (Leicester Tigers) stadium and less than 0.9 miles or a 17-minute walk from Leicester City Football Club's King Power stadium. Welford Road acts as a main arterial vehicle and pedestrian route which connects the city centre to both stadiums.

The premises have an enclosed courtyard at the rear of the premises, which acts as a customer beer garden/courtyard. The courtyard is accessed via the premises itself, however there is an emergency fire exit between the premises and the off licence next door at 84 Welford Road.

The enclosed courtyard backs onto 1 Regent Park Mews (Regent Road) which includes two residential flats. The windows to these flats overlook the premises courtyard. Further residential flats are located at 3 Regent Road.

Further residential properties are located directly opposite the premises on Pelham Way.

The application fails to address how it will manage the outdoor areas and prevent public nuisance. The application also fails to address how it will reduce the likelihood of crime, disorder and public nuisance as customers enter and leave the premises in the early hours of the morning.

The applicant has applied to open the premises two hours earlier in the morning than before. However, licensable activities will not commence until 10am as per the current licence

The applicant wishes to extend its licensable hours for most licensable activities between Wednesday and Saturday and operate until 3am.

Whilst the premises existing opening hours to the public are "unrestricted" the applicant intends to amend this to 30 minutes after licensable activities cease.

It is the extended operating hours on Wednesday to Saturday that concerns Leicestershire Police.

The premises proximity to residential properties is very likely to result in public nuisance to local residents. Noise in the form of music or customers voices during entry and egress but also whilst customers use the rear courtyard. However, noise escape from inside the premises itself is also a concern.

Leicestershire Police's is also concerned that the late operating hours are likely to result in an increase in crime and disorder, given that alcohol related violent crime increases in the early hours of the morning, given more time that customers are permitted to consume alcohol.

Leicestershire Police are also concerned about crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour on Leicester City Football Club home matchdays and how the premises will manage home and away supporters, pre and post-match. In the past rival supporters have clashed directly outside the premises, as home supporters rushed out of the venue and clashed with away supporters as they passed by.

Leicestershire Police do not support the increase in hours for the following licensable activities:

(1) The provision of "Live music" – Wednesday to Saturday from 2am until 3am (+1 hour). The police would seek no change in the current hours.

Leicestershire Police also believe the New Year's Eve de-regulation rule allowing continued licensable activity is outdated and no longer fit for purpose.

Leicestershire Police are seeking an agreement with the applicant and the inclusion of additional conditions in order to mitigate the above concerns. However, at the time of submitting this representation, an agreement has not been reached.

Therefore, Leicestershire Police currently wish to submit a representation as the current application to extend its operating hours and remove the existing Annex 2 conditions, fails to support two of three licensing objectives. Leicestershire Police respectfully requests that the application be refused.

I refer to the above-mentioned application for a variation of premises licence for The Bricklayers Arm, 78 Welford Road, Leicester. My representation relates to the prevention of Public Nuisance.

The premises is near residential properties on Regent Road and on Welford Road, Leicester.

I am concerned that if the variation is granted as applied for, without further measures to control noise from the premises, it is likely that noise nuisance will occur.

Therefore, in order to prevent the occurrence of public nuisance I recommend that unless suitable conditions are placed upon the licence to protect nearby residence the application should be refused.

Recommended Conditions

- 1) All external doors and windows must be kept closed, other than for access and egress, in all rooms when events involving live music and recorded music are taking place.
- 2) The outdoor courtyard (beer garden) must not be used between 9pm and 8am daily.
- 3) All amplified music, voice and film must be played through the sound limiting device currently installed at the premises.
- 4) Disposal of waste bottles into external receptacles where the noise will be audible to neighbouring properties must not occur between 21.00 hours and 09.00 hours.
- 5) Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exits and in designated smoking areas requesting customers and staff respect the needs of residents by keeping noise to a minimum when using the outside area and when leaving the premises.
- 6) The licensee shall take reasonable steps to prevent public nuisance being caused by customers outside whilst smoking.

However, I have had a telephone conversation with Sam Okafor (DPS) regarding the likelihood of public nuisance and the measures considered necessary to prevent its occurrence. He appears willing for the above conditions to be added to the licence. I have requested that the applicant contacts the Licensing Department to formally agree to the request that conditions be added to the licence.

The application is for a major variation of a Premises Licence which looks to:

- (a) Extend all licensable activities on Wednesday to Saturdays until 03:00hrs.
- (b) Add provision of Films from Sundays to Tuesday from 10.00hrs to 02.00hrs and Wednesdays to Saturdays from 10.00hrs to 03.00hrs.

- (c) Change the opening hours of the premises to Sundays to Tuesdays from 08:00hrs until 02:30hrs and Wednesdays to Saturdays from 08:00hrs until 03:30hrs.
- (d) Add a non-standard timing for all licensable and opening hours
- (e) Remove a condition within Annex 2.

The premises is located at 78 Welford Road, within Leicester City in close proximity to various residential properties (blocks of flats, flats above commercial premises and houses), Leicester Royal Infirmary (LRI), offices, and shops. There is a multi-story car park on Regent Road. Welford Road is an arterial route into and out of the city giving access to LRI, LCFC stadium, Leicester Tigers and HMP Leicester Prison.

The premises entrance is directly located on Welford Road and backs onto Regent Road with a side exit and a beer garden at the rear.

Contact was made on 9th August 2022 with Flint Bishop Solicitors who are the agents for the applicant, who confirmed they wanted to remove from Annex 2, only the condition which states "The Licence is subject to Leicester City Council's Standard Conditions for Places of Public Entertainment, published on the Licensing Authority's website www.leicester.gov.uk/licensing" Flint Bishop Solicitors were cooperative and wanted to work with LCC.

The additional hour extension of licensable activities including the addition of provision of films allows for a later drinking facility and also the ability for persons to arrive later at the premises after having consumed alcohol at other locations. Even though the premises has been long running, the change of activities (such as showing films) is likely to diversify the type of persons attending. It may also attract a more student base which in itself also provides challenges.

Even though the ethos of the premises may remain the same, it is in our opinion that the appearance of minor changes can actually result in significant opportunities of the licensing objectives being difficult to uphold.

The operating schedule must indicate the methods, processes or key objectives that would show how the licence holder would uphold these.

Conditions Details:

We believe the below additions/amendments of conditions in full, which we believe are reasonable, proportionate and enforceable, may assist the Licence Holder in upholding the licensing objectives.

We have detailed, for clarity, those that

- (a) We believe should be replaced from the applied operating schedule with our proposed wording
- (b) Those to be removed from the operating schedule and;
- (c) Those that are in addition.

Any wording on the operating schedule that is not detailed below to remain on any licence

(a) Conditions to be replaced from Operating Schedule

Wording contained within the applied operating schedule as copied below be <u>replaced</u> with Requested Condition/s:

Operating Schedule Wording:

The licence holder will ensure that CCTV is installed following advice from the Leicestershire Constabulary and maintained in accordance with the Information Commissioner's CCTV Code of Practice. Images will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and be made available to Police and Council Licensing Officers within 48 hours of the request being made.

The licence holder will ensure children will only be permitted when accompanied by an adult.

The licence holder will ensure the Challenge 21 policy will be used whereby those persons who appear who appear to be under the age of 21 and are attempting to purchase alcohol will be asked for identification. The only type of identification that will be accepted is a passport, photo driving licence or any other PASS accredited identification. Staff will be trained in this policy and records will be kept.

To be replaced with:

- The licence holder will ensure a high definition, coloured CCTV camera system is installed, operational and recording whilst the premises is open to the public. The system must permit the identification of individuals at key points which must be considered in conjunction with Leicestershire Police.
- CCTV images must be securely stored, display an accurate date/time stamp and retained for a minimum of 31 days. Cameras must cover all areas that the public have access to, including the entrance/exit and pavement area immediately outside the premises.
- The licence holder will ensure that there is always a member of staff trained and available to download images/footage immediately or an agreed timescale if requested by the police or the Licensing Authority.
- The licence holder will ensure that children are accompanied by an adult at all times the premises is open.
- The Challenge 25 policy will be adopted and there will be documented training of all staff (paid or unpaid) before they are allowed to sell alcohol. These records to remain on the premises and will be made available to the authorities upon request.

(b) Conditions to be removed from Operating Schedule

(c) Requested Additional Conditions

Condition/s wording below to be added in full to any granted licence:

- A personal licence holder must be working (either paid or unpaid) at the premises during all times alcohol is sold or offered for sale.

- The licence holder will ensure that a full fire risk assessment will be conducted, reviewed and implemented in line with Fire Safety Legislation annually.
- The licence holder will ensure that safety checks are carried out every day before the premises opens for business, and all checks will be recorded in a logbook which will be kept on site.
- There will be regular safety and security checks of areas such as toilets and entrances/exits.
- The Licence Holder will ensure that prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exits and in designated smoking areas requesting customers and staff respect the needs of local residents by keeping noise to a minimum when using the outside area and when leaving the premises.
- The licence holder shall take reasonable steps to prevent public nuisance being caused by customers outside whilst smoking.
- The licence holder will ensure that no customers shall take away alcohol in open containers.
- The licence holder will ensure that any external area is monitored and regularly checked and cleared of any glasses, containers or debris.
