Highways Update and Upcoming Works

Highways Maintenance Works

We continue to inspect the footways and carriageways around the ward and in the last 12 months have found actionable defects as follows:

- Carriageway 216 orders
- Footway 173orders

We have just completed the first phase of Victoria Road East and the remainder Cordelia Close up to and including the Hastings Road junction being done in the Feb school holidays (½ in the Ward)

School Streets

Sandfield Close Primary School:

There is a Walk to School Programme; Park and Stride set up and promoted. Bike ability has been delivered this calendar year and an ongoing program to encourage cycling with pupils, parents, and teachers. The school street has been made permanent and the school staff continue to manage this themselves.

North Mead Primary Academy and Falcon Primary:

Both have less pupils turning up by car and so less resources are required in these locations, although Falcon Primary did receive support with cycling to school during the last school year.



If you witness littering from a vehicle and you've filmed it, we can investigate.
We require a short statement and your footage to allow us to make a DVLA check.

You will **NOT** be required to attend court because littering is a civil offence.

Advice for residents

Householders are legally responsible for all household waste produced on their property. Most household waste can be disposed of in your wheeled bins or bags.

If you need to dispose of large items such as sofas, fridges or building materials, there are several ways to do this legally:

- Take large items to your council-run tip.
 Find out opening times and days online.
- Consider hiring a skip. They can be value for money and you don't need a permit if they are stored on your property.
- Your council can dispose of your large waste items as part of the bulky waste collection service.
- You can subscribe to a garden waste collection for an annual fee.

Advice for businesses



Under the Environmental Protection Act, every business has a duty of care when it comes to disposing of it's waste. If you are not meeting your legal responsibilities it could result in a fine or imprisonment.

Here are a few tips:

- It is a legal requirement for businesses to use a licensed waste carrier to remove their waste – check they are registered.
- If you are running a business from home you will still need to dispose of your waste correctly - you should not use your household waste collection.
- Provide a written description of your waste to the company collecting your waste.
- Keep a signed copy of your Waste Transfer Notes - you must keep these for 2 years.
- Take action if you think your waste is being mishandled by those who remove it – you could be fined if they are illegally fly-tipping this waste.

Many councils offer competitive and easy to use waste and recycling services for businesses such as business waste collections or trade waste sites, which will ensure you comply with the above requirements. Check with your local authority for more information.

CITY WARDEN UPDATE

FLY TIPPING

If you spot fly tipping please report this to us so we can take further action. Also, if you have witnessed fly tipping and are able to identify the individuals please contact us so we can arrange to take a witness statement from you. Without witness statements and without evidence from within the waste we are unable to take further action. If you have CCTV or other video footage we require a witness statement in order to use the footage.



WASTE ON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAY

Enforcement action is being taken on residents who continuously leave waste outside of their properties on the public highway. Community Protection Warning, Notices and Fixed Penalty Notices are being served. This includes waste that has been booked in for a Bulky Collection but has been placed on the public highway too soon. Waste should be present outside of the property on the day that the collection has been booked for.



FLY POSTING AND A-BOARDS

Multiple fly posters have been taken down from street furniture and have been removed from the public highway where they have been installed without permission. This has lead to multiple Fixed Penalty Notices (FPN's) being issued.

One company has been issued four FPN's due to fly posting on Lewisher Road.

VEHICLES FOR SALE/REPAIR

We are receiving more reports of vehicles being repaired or sold on the public highway. If this is observed, please report this to us so we can take a witness statement, we would also need photos and/or footage clearly showing what is taking place. If vehicles are abandoned or in poor condition this would need to be reported to Cleansing Services as they are able to take action on these vehicles.
