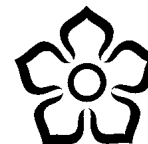

Appendix 1

Highways Update and Upcoming Works

Highways Maintenance Works

23/24

Marwood Road carriageway resurfacing scheme - completed in August 2023
Hoods Close resurfacing scheme - completed in November 2023

24/25

Parker Drive concrete bay replacement scheme - completed in April 2024
Hadrian Road concrete bay replacement scheme – still to be programmed.

Redhill hill flyover bearing and joint replacement work as well as parapet repairs was completed in the Spring. We still have some vehicle restraint system (crash barrier) works to finish, which we will be undertaking next month.

We are currently drawing up plans for joint replacement, resurfacing and parapet repairs on St Margarets River Bridge. This work will be programmed for this financial year.

We continue to inspect the footways and carriageways around the ward and in the last 6 months have found actionable defects as follows:

- Carriageway - 250 orders
- Footway - 205 orders

Road Safety Schemes

There was investigation into a 20mph scheme for Orton and Hobson Road, but this was incorporated into the Wolsey House 20mph scheme. This came into force on 24th April. A plan of the area is attached to these notes. As part of this scheme, speed cushions were also installed on Thurcaston Road.

School Streets

Our Parking Enforcement team continues to visit schools in the ward, at drop off and pick up times to enforce parking restrictions. Latest visits are:

We will be offering the Walk to School programme to Alderman Richard Hallam and Wolsey House Schools and will continue to promote the Park and Stride at the Space Centre.

Other Highway Works

5-Ways / Woodgate

Works have now been completed on Frog Island and Northgate Street as part the Transforming Cities/ Waterside development works. This includes segregated bike lanes and declassifying the route (it is no longer the routes of the A50).

There have also been improvements to the junction with Slater St School to help children and parents. At Soar Lane works are ongoing to link through to Rally Park, where improvements start onsite from the 15th July.

A6 bus lanes

We are currently considering the results of the consultation and engagement exercise. We will be in touch with the ward councillors as soon as this is complete.

Beaumont Leys Lane/Abbey Lane

We are currently on site installing better walking and cycling infrastructure on Beaumont Leys lane. This will be finished with the resurfacing of Beaumont Leys Lane, between Halifax Drive and Abbey Lane (including the junction).

The resurfacing phase is programmed to start and finish in August, before the schools return.

Highcross St Developer Works – The footpath is closed on the section of Highcross St, between Vaughan Way and All Saints Open.

Traffic Regulation Orders

We currently have a project underway in Abbey ward on Great Central Street to introduce three 2-hour limited waiting bays, no return within 2hours. Operational times 7:30am to 6pm, all other times unrestricted and to introduce a loading bay at the end of Friars Causeway, operational at all times. Stage 1 consultation is complete, and it will soon be going out for public consultation.

Dog fouling

I have received dog fouling complaints in several locations, Aversham Road, Avebury Road & Burnham Drive. Signage has been put up in these locations.

Fly tipping
