1.	Introductions & Apologies, Declarations <ul style="list-style-type: none">The Chair, Cllr Osman, opened the meeting and welcomed everyone.No declarations were noted.Apologies noted.Agenda order revised to accommodate the Police Crime and Commissioner attending.	
2.	Councillors Feedback <ul style="list-style-type: none">The meeting noted an update from Councillors.Cllr Aldred and Cllr Osman updated on the Local Plan - Inspectorate Response Letter.The response letter sets out the view of the local plan.Councillors outlined the six-week timeline to respond to the Inspectorates views.ACTION - Cllr Osman agreed to send the letter to be displayed in the centre.Residents Noted – There was a link to additional houses being built and increased flooding.Councillors agreed to work with residents on the flooding issues in the ward.	
3.	Traffic and Highways Update <ul style="list-style-type: none">Rupert Bedder updated the meeting on the actions from the previous meeting, and on current developments.Concerns and complaints on pavement issues were raised and picked up by Rupert.Parking enforcement issues also raised, Rupert to arrange to investigate 'dropped curb' parking.<u>Flooding Matters in the Ward –</u>Rupert requested the addresses of properties affected by the floods. These will be addressed with the joint meeting and visit between LCC and the Environment Agency.Rupert explained to the meeting the role and responsibilities of the lead local flood authority (Section 19) Flood Act.Road Gullies, Drain Flooding, are the joint responsibility of LCC and Severn Trent.<u>Action – Meeting to address Flooding Matters to be arranged.</u>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The chair welcomed Rupert Matthews, the Leicestershire Police Crime and Commissioner to the meeting. ▪ The Crime Commissioner set out the Police and Crime Commissioners role, as the elected official, tasked with setting out the way crime is tackled by the Leicestershire police. ▪ Mr Matthews provided a brief overview and then undertook a Questions and Answer session from the floor. ▪ Neighbourhood Watch – Support and Liaison. ▪ Percentage of council taxpaid to the PCC role. ▪ How is the PCC proactively involved in crime and prevention. ▪ What percentage of funding spent in the Thurncourt ward.
