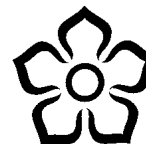

Councillors Feedback <ul style="list-style-type: none">The meeting noted an update from Councillors <p><u>Cllr Deepak Bajaj –</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Patch Walk undertaken in Rowlatts Hill area, two trucks rubbish, including white goods arranged and taken by Biffa.Continuation of case work, includes ASB and Housing mattersHighlighted that Golden Token have contributed to a significant reduction in ASB and knife crime in the area.Highlighted Remembrance Service attendanceUpdated on Phase One of Hospital Close completed, tenants have begun to move in. <p><u>Cllr Zuffar Haq –</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Updated on continued work to improve the poor quality of service, bus not turning up of the 22 Bus service route.Raised concerns in increased car parking issues, following the charges being introduced on the 'Hospital Hopper' service. The concerns are that hospital staff car parking will be dispersed within the ward.Cllr Haq is looking to pursue the resident's car parking scheme within areas in the ward.Continued surgeries and case work.

The figures overall showed a decrease in Burglary, Theft, Theft from motor vehicle, Criminal Damage. • Beat priorities – Commercial Theft / Theft form stores <p>Update on Operation Syphon –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Road safety Op. • Education Phase complete Enforcement stage has started. • Times of school patrols to be reviewed • E/bikes / E/scooters – ‘peddle-fast linked to op Syphon. Nearly 50 bikes seized in 3 days. • Police have a section in the Evington Echo, promoting the police surgeries.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The meeting noted the update and comments for Traffic and Highway – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complaint regarding the bollards on near Whitehall Primary School / Whitehall Road. • Request for bollards to be removed, to prevent accidents as considered a hazard. • Markings leading to the school require reviewing, as markings only to the back. • Road to school also considered an hazard to people with pushchairs and prams. <p><u>Goodwood Residents Association –</u></p>
