6. APPLICATION FOR A REVIEW OF AN EXISTING PREMISES LICENCE - BALTIC, 128A NARBOROUGH ROAD, LEICESTER, LE3 0BT

Prior to the start of the hearing, an email reportedly from Mr Nazar Obaid, the Premises Licence Holder, was received by the Sub-Committee at 10:23am on 17th November to confirm that he instructed Mr Rob Edge, licensing agent from Licence Leader Ltd, as his representative at the hearing.

Councillor Pickering, as Chair led on introductions and outlined the procedure the hearing would follow.

The Director of Neighbourhood and Environmental Services submitted a report on an application for a review of an existing premises licence for Baltic, 128a Narborough Road, Leicester, LE3 0BT.

PC Jeff Pritchard and PC Robert Gist were present having made representations on behalf of Leicestershire Police. Noel Cazley, Fatema Burani and Robert Lowe from Trading Standards were in attendance as witnesses. Mr Rob Edge, licensing agent was present to represent the Licence Holder. Also present were the Service Manager (Regulatory Services) and the Legal Adviser to the Sub-Committee.

Following the commencement of the hearing, Mr Edge informed the Sub-Committee that in light of information he had come across prior to the hearing, he was instructed to offer to surrender the licence with immediate effect.

PC Pritchard representing the Police asked for a short adjournment to consider the offer of a surrender of a licence.

Following a short adjournment, PC Pritchard requested the committee to determine the application for a review as the offer of a surrender did not preclude an application for a transfer of the premises licence.

Section 28 of the Licensing Act 2003 requires the Premises Licence Holder to give notice to the Licensing Authority. The Notice must be accompanied by the premises licence. The Premises Licence lapses when it is received by the Licensing Authority together with the Notice of Surrender. Section 50 of the Licensing Act 2003 makes provision for reinstatement of a licence surrendered under section 28.

Mr Edge did not object to the request by the Police for committee to proceed and determine the application for review.

Mr Edge did not want to inconvenience the committee beyond what was necessary and confirmed that he was content for the information and evidence for the review to be presented in summary form.

The Service Manager (Regulatory Services) presented the report.

PC Jeff Pritchard was given the opportunity to outline the details of the Police representation.

Mr Edge did not challenge the evidence presented at the hearing or any of the information contained in the review application and supporting evidence.

All parties were given the opportunity to sum up their positions and make any final comments.

The Sub-Committee received legal advice from the Legal Adviser to the Sub-Committee in the presence of all those present and were advised of the options available to them in making their decision.

The Sub-Committee were also advised of the relevant policy and statutory guidance that needed to be taken into account when making their decision,

In reaching their decision, the Sub-Committee felt they should deliberate in private on the basis that this was in the public interest and as such outweighed the public interest of their deliberation taking place with the parties represented present, in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

The Chair announced that the decisions and reasons would be publicly announced and confirmed in writing within five working days. The Chair informed the meeting that the Legal Adviser to the Sub-Committee would be called back to give advice on the wording of the decision.

The Chair then asked all but Members of the Sub-Committee and Democratic Support Officers to withdraw from the meeting. Members then deliberated in private to consider their decision.

The Sub-Committee recalled the Legal Adviser to the Sub-Committee to give advice on the wording of the decision.

RESOLVED:

That as a result of the representations made to the Sub-Committee, it was satisfied that the representations by Leicestershire Police engaged the licensing objectives relating to the crime and disorder and public safety and committee accordingly determined that in light of the evidence presented to it, it was appropriate and proportionate to **REVOKE** the licence.

The reasons for the decision would be provided in writing to all parties within five working days.

The Premises Licence Holder would be informed of their right to appeal the decision within 21 days of receiving the decision.

1. Summary

- 1.1 This report outlines an application under the Licensing Act 2003 for a new premises licence for Amigo Grill, 27 Narborough Road, Leicester and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives and the relevant parts of both the statutory guidance and the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

2. Determination to be made

- 2.1 Having considered the application and representations, Members must consider whether to
- Grant the licence without modification
 - Grant the licence subject to conditions
 - Exclude from the licence any of the licensable activities
 - Refuse to accept the proposed premises supervisor
 - Reject the application

3. Application and promotion of the licensing objectives

- 3.1 An application was received on 13 November 2025 from Haleema Khan for a new premises licence for Amigo Grill, 27 Narborough Road, Leicester. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.

- 3.2 The application is as follows:

Licensable activity	Proposed hours
Late night refreshment	Mon – Sun 23.00 – 05.00
Opening hours	Mon – Sun 09.30 – 05.00

- 3.3 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section M of Appendix A).
- 3.4 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

4. Representations

- 4.1 A representation was received on 17 November 2025 from the Police. The representation relates to the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm. The representee is concerned that the premises is located within an area of special interest as referred to in the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy. The applicant has not referred to this policy and the application is very vague and lacks any mitigating measures to promote the licensing objectives. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix B1.
- 4.2 A representation was received on 09 December 2025 from the Noise team. The representation relates to the prevention of public nuisance. The representee is concerned that the late hours requested would increase noise from the ventilation at the premises, delivery vehicles and people noise which may impact the nearby residents. They have been in contact with the applicant and have agreed conditions. A copy of the representation and agreement is attached at Appendix B2.

5. Conditions

- 5.1 The conditions that are consistent with the application and the representation are attached at Appendix C.

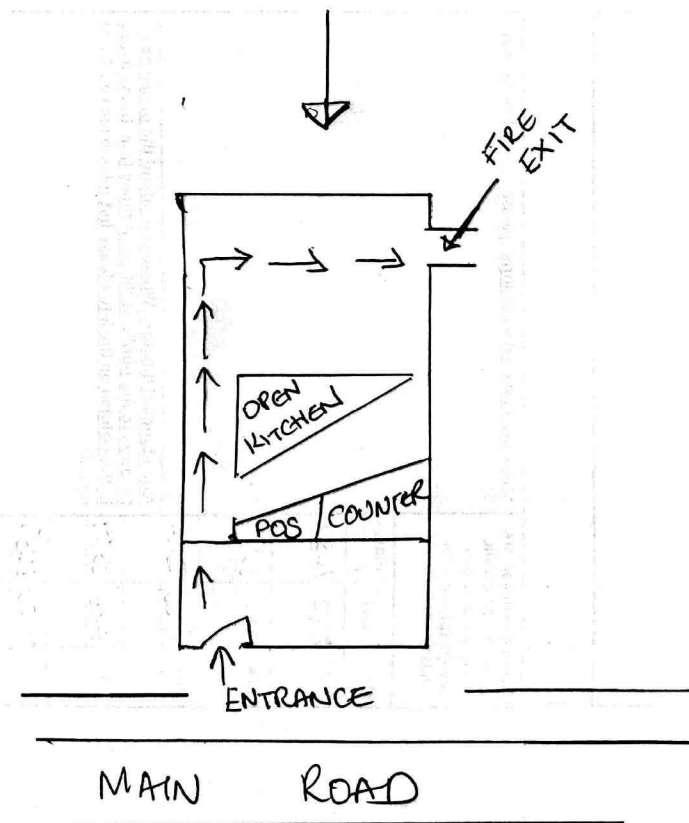

<p>I write in my capacity as Leicester City centre's alcohol licensing officer for Leicestershire Police, with delegated authority from the Chief Constable.</p> <p>My representation to this new premises licence application is based upon three of the four licensing objectives as per the Licensing Act 2003. Those being:</p> <p>(1) The prevention of crime and disorder.</p> <p>(2) The prevention of public nuisance.</p>

(3) The protection of children from harm.

This is a new application for 27 Narborough Road, Leicester. LE3 0LE.

The two previous applications were rejected as the applicant failed to correctly advertise the proposal in the local press.

The application describes the premises as being a hot and cold desert shop, which also supplies pizza and other hot food.

Therefore, the only requested licensable activity is the provision of late-night refreshment, daily from 11pm until 5am.

The applicant states the premises will be open to the public daily from 9:30am until 5am.

The premises is located on the city bound carriage way of Narborough Road, opposite Celt Street.

Narborough Road acts as a major arterial route into and out of the city and is busy 24 hours a day from both a pedestrian and motor vehicle perspective.

The Narborough Road corridor is a high-density residential area, with a lot of licensed premises and other similar premises located on the ground floor, with residential properties above. The surrounding streets consist of terraced housing.

The premises itself backs onto residential properties along Cranmer Street.

The premises is located within an area of "special interest" as referred to in Leicester City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy 2022-2027.

The application does not refer to this policy, so it is unclear if the applicant is aware and/or has considered the significance of the area, when submitting the application.

The application itself is vague and lacks any mitigating measures in order to promote the licensing objectives.

The applicant does refer to "*CCTV and trained staff members*" within Section M but does not elaborate.

The proposed operating hours until 5am in the morning, gives Leicestershire Police concern and more so given existing challenges that other late-night operators already face.

Leicestershire Police believe the premises will act as a magnet and will result in people congregating inside and outside the venue in the early hours of morning, as they source hot and/or cold food and are likely to be under the influence of alcohol.

Several licensed premises which supply alcohol are located nearby at 11, 13, 17 and 29 Narborough Road.

Therefore, there is a real possibility of anti-social behaviour in the form of noise and even crime and disorder, as customers congregate.

It is also possible that two nearby 24/7 gaming centres at 35-37 and 39-41 Narborough Road will draw customers to the venue in the early hours of the morning.

Given the nature of the business, there is a strong possibility that younger clientele and children under the age of 18 years will attend the premises in the night-time economy/early hours of the morning. The application does not address how the applicant would protect these children from harm at this time of the morning.

Leicestershire Police respectfully requests the application is refused as it fails to promote the licensing objectives.

<p>Narborough Road is a busy street with many similar hot takeaway premises in the vicinity. There are residential properties directly behind with a flat on the first floor.</p> <p>The main concerns with this application are regarding the opening times and the provision of late-night refreshment which have been requested until 05:00 AM on all days. Although Narborough Road is a busy business area, it does quieten down into the early hours of the morning. The main sources of noise would be the operation of the ventilation flue, people noise and delivery vehicles, potentially impacting the properties behind as well as the flat above. Also, there is potential for delivery vehicles coming and going to disrupt the flat above.</p> <p>I have consulted the licensing database and this shows that the premises previously operated until 04:00 on all days including late night refreshment. There were no known issues with the premises in terms of noise/odour.</p>
