**Project: Burglary Target Hardening Project**

**Amount: see summary below**

**Applicant: Inspector Bill Knopp (Spinney Hill Local Policing Unit) and Nazira Vania (Leicester City Council Community Safety Team)**

**Summary:**

There has been an increase in burglaries in the Spinney Hill Local Policing Unit area (which includes Thurncourt Ward) so, as a crime prevention measure, it is proposed to provide timer switches and window alarms in hotspot areas.

The alarms are attached to accessible windows and the alarm goes off if the window is hit or broken. It is anticipated that the average property would require 4 window alarms and 1 timer switch, equating to £12 per property.

Initially the aim is to target 100 properties in the area at an estimated cost of £1,200. The window alarms cost £2.50 each and the timer switches cost £2.00 each.

£500 for this project has been agreed by the Ward members under the Council's fast-track procedures, so a further £700 is requested at this meeting.

**Project: Cinema Club**

**Amount: £2,276.60**

Applicant: Thurnby Lodge Tenants and Residents Association

Summary:

This proposal is for funding for a Cinema Club. The success of the Club will be assessed through feedback from users.

Residents will be asked what kind of films they want to see and how often.

Funding has been requested for the purchase of a screen, projector, sound system, dvd player, all cabling and electrical equipment.

**Project: Sunbury United Football Club**

The Thurnby Lodge Community Carnival will take place on Saturday 7 July 2012. It will be held on Willowbrook Park in partnership with the City Parks service.

It is estimated that the number attending will be 3,000+ and, as in previous years, all the groups who use the community centre will be invited to take part. In addition, youth groups active in the area will take a leading role.

The Thurnby Lodge Community Forum is primarily focused on youth work and actively promotes those groups operating in the area.

The Wednesday Club has 30+ members and meets weekly. It provides an opportunity for elderly people living in the surrounding area to engage in social interaction.

At this time of year there are issues which face older people and looking forward to the opportunity of a visit to the coast would give a boost to their feelings of wellbeing.
