#### **Application 1**

Applicant: Tudor pre-School.

Amount: £800

Proposal: Pre-school trip

Summary: We would like the opportunity to take the children who attend our

setting on a trip to Twycross Zoo. As well as being a fun day for the children, it will provide an educational opportunity to gain knowledge of the living world our children may not otherwise get as many of them do not often get to leave the local area due to

economic factors affecting families.

We hope that the trip will have many positive outcomes for families. It will continue to build on our partnership with parents. It will encourage communication and give quality time between parents and children helping to strengthen families. It will also give parents a chance to get to know each other, building

relationships within the community.

between 1330 and 1630 at Richard Hallam School. The event aims to build on the events held over the previous five years. It will generally be similar to the extended event successfully held in 2011 thanks to generous funding from the three council wards.

The event is free – no charge will be imposed on those who

attend other than refreshments.

Amount: £500

Proposal: Queens Diamond Jubilee Celebration

Summary: We would like to celebrate the Queen's Diamond Jubillee, by
