Bob will also invite interested members of the community to be part of a small liaison group to meet with the builders whilst the programme is in progress.

**Project 2876: Sandfield School PTA Summer Fun Day – Saturday 22 June 2013**

Amount requested: £574

The Sandfield School PTA is requesting support towards costs for holding their annual Summer Fun Day.

The PTA have organised a summer fete for the last four years, which has been a growing event bringing together the local community, parents, local agencies, organisations and the school.

The event aims to widen community participation through the provision of a range of activities for families, greater interaction between communities and a wider awareness of what is being offered by groups, community and voluntary organisations and the school.

The theme for 2013 is “foods of the world”. An opportunity to experience cuisine from Asia & East Africa.

The grant will support the following, which will consist of a range of activities including entertainment area (performances from local dance and music groups), games designed and made by school children, fairground rides, information and activity stalls, food and drink stalls and sports activities facilitated by local sports organisations.

The grant will enable them to develop the activities on offer further by supporting the entertainment element of the fete through hire of a DJ & sound system, development of a dance show of local performers, hire of equipment such as gazebos, tables & chairs.

### **Project 2877: Social and welfare and get together**

Amount requested: £1080

The proposal is to run activity days on Sundays at the Rushey Mead Recreation Centre.

These activities are open to Members and non-members and will take place one Sunday a month for twelve months. Eventually this will be every Sunday.

The activities will include health talks, issues relating to social and welfare, as a meeting place to share ideas and have fun and games too. This is aimed at young and elderly members of the Satya Community Group as well as non-

members.

Following some events already held at some members' houses, the project seems to be successful, however due to space they cannot accommodate all. As most of our members reside in the Rushey Mead and Belgrave Area, they are certain the attendance would be higher with the venue being nearer.

Funding of £1080 is requested for venue hire (£90 x 12)

### **Project 2878: Drumkit teaching club for music students**

Amount requested: 260.40

The proposals are to facilitate the development (musically), of chiefly, young people who presently may be at a 'loose end – notably in the city's more economically deprived areas. Many various musical events can be planned from a weekly drum clinic to a day-long multi person assembly at a low cost. The sessions are planned at the Rushey Mead Recreational Centre for young people aged 6 – 16 plus.

Funding of £260 is requested for the hire of the hall

### **Project 2879: New Wycliffe Home Community Day**

Amount requested: £1200

New Wycliffe Home is a residential home in Rushey Mead, for people with sight loss. The home also has a specialism in services for people with sight loss and dementia.

On 18 August, the New Wycliffe Home is planning a community day at the site on Gleneagles Avenue. This will be open to all residents of the Rushey Mead Ward. It will act as an information point for local residents to understand more about Vista's work. 50% of all sight loss in the UK is avoidable and Vista works more in the community than ever to spread messages about good eye health.

The fun day will benefit the residents of the home by having a community day which provides social activities leading to better well-being.

The event will offer education opportunities to local people within a fun, non-invasive and local context. The coming into the home environment will offer them a way of exploring at first hand what they do at the home.

The fun day will include activities including face painting and children's arts and craft activities, henna tattoos, performing arts and sporting activities. The event will run in the afternoon and there is adequate indoor space for activities to take

place should there be adverse weather.
